As a community of Christians who celebrate the centrality of the Lord's Supper, we experience the table of Christ as an open and welcoming table. For us, the table is a meeting place where the inclusive love of God encountered in Jesus Christ gathers together those who confess Jesus Christ as Lord, nurtures them, and seeks to create a sense of community among them and with the larger world. Yet the table is not our own. We encounter God's unmerited grace as guests at the table, and as such, we cannot put limits upon God's grace in different contexts.

As we approach Thanksgiving next week, many of us are mindful of the importance of being seated around a table. During these busy holidays we'll spend a lot of time sharing fellowship and food around a variety of tables. Some tables will be in the midst of families, some will be round tables set up here at the church, and some tables may be small ones where we sit alone. Whatever our context, we'll spend some time, with others or alone, eating at a table. For some it will be a long table at which family and friends are seated. For some, it may be as simple as a TV tray. The above quote from the Council of Christian Unity reminds us, as Disciples we gather around a Table every week as we come together for worship. The Table is central for us as a faith community and, often, as individuals and families.

As Thanksgiving reminds us, the Table in the sanctuary isn't the only Table. People of different traditions and faith gather around their own tables as well. Whether it's a Sabbath meal on Friday evening in a Jewish home, a feast table marking the end of Ramadan in a Muslim home, or worship on Sunday morning in a Christian church; we all gather around a table in many different ways and at various times. Cultivating this sense of awareness and respecting the various Christian and interfaith traditions in our world today, is the very heart of why we engage in ecumenical and interfaith dialogue. This willingness to encounter our brothers and sisters of different faiths and traditions is one of the facets of life here at FCC that drew me to serve this congregation. This congregation engages in ecumenical and interfaith dialogue and activities in many different ways. The Wednesday evening adult class has spent time studying Islam (last year) and Judaism (this fall) through reading, watching videos and sharing in conversation. Many of us attend, and some even help plan, the annual Mayor's Interfaith Prayer Breakfast. This coming Sunday, 18 November at 3 pm, we're invited to share in the annual Interfaith Thanksgiving service, this year it will be at one of our Jewish synagogues here in Lincoln (details are on page 1 in this edition of the Messenger).

As we gather around our various tables this holiday season, may we do so with true thanksgiving and deeper joy. May we remember all our brothers and sisters who gather around their tables as well. "The Table is prepared, the feast is ready. God invites us all to come with hearts full of joy and thanksgiving."
