Celebrating 150 Years

First Christian Church Disciples of Christ This year we celebrate our 150th anniversary as a faith community in

Lincoln. A look at our history helps ground us as we continue to serve from our doorsteps to the ends of the earth. So we're fortunate that some records from our past have been preserved. One of those is a publication called *The Church at Work*, a newsletter produced weekly from January 4, 1907 until it was discontinued during the Great Depression. We hope to share some information from this newsletter in the *Messenger* throughout 2019.

The Church at Work was launched so that "we can reach all members through this channel weekly. The Cadet boys of the Bible School will give valuable assistance in its delivery."

Harvey Harmon was our pastor in 1907. Gertrude Holmes was listed as Deaconess and Olive Griffith was our foreign missionary in Damoh, India. Morning worship was at 10:30 a.m., with Bible School at 12:10 p.m. Evening worship was at 7:30 p.m., following an afternoon of youth activities.

The Church at Work cost subscribers 25 cents a year. Most of the publication's costs were funded by more than a dozen advertisers. Castle, Roper & Matthews Undertakers advertised a private ambulance. Other advertisers included Lincoln Lumber and Coal Co., Scotch Company Woolen Mills located on O Street and Jacoby Art Glass, a St. Louis company that provided the stained glass windows for the building on 14th and M. Some of these windows are now located in the north hall on the first floor of our current building.

A year after inception several church members were asked for their opinions about *The Church at Work*. Bird Critchfield said he "Cannot do without it." George Lobinger stated "The paper is improving". However, G. H. Exley said he "would just as soon do without it; should always be out on time." And Edwin Jeary commented "It is all right". So it's reassuring to know that our members have always felt free to speak their minds!

Today we'll share an article appearing in the Jan. 1, 1909 edition about the new building at 14th and M. It is entitled "The Church":

"We are indebted to the State Journal for the cut (photo) of the new church building which we present in this issue. When complete the building will be an example of modern architecture and replete as a workshop for the church and all departments. The heating plant is in perfect working order. We hold our first services in the basement next Sunday. This room is spacious and will furnish very satisfactory quarters for the next three months. All services on next Lord's Day will be held in this room and it should be the occasion for joyful services throughout the day."
