Pastor's Corner

Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!"

- - Luke 9:35

Arguments about who can be considered God's Chosen have divided the faithful throughout the ages. In this passage from Luke, which we'll read on the 3rd of March for Transfiguration of the Lord, we have these memorable words spoken from cloud about Jesus; "This is my Son, my chosen; listen to him!" God chose Jesus, and by extension, God chooses each and all of us. This brings great comfort and great responsibility. We are invited to take comfort in the knowledge that God has chosen each and every one of us. We don't need to worry about who's in and who's not. Just as God has chosen each of us, we know that God does so for everyone. This invites us to be welcoming and hospitable to all.

The challenge for us as God's chosen, is that things sometimes get in the way of our ability to recognize that we, and others, are chosen. In our Lenten devotional this year the author invites us to lean in and let go. We are invited to lean into the awareness that God has chosen us and loves us beyond measure. With that comes the ability to let go of those things that impede our awareness of God's love and presence. We'll also move more deeply into this invitation to lean in and let go in our small groups. We'll be doing a study by Marjorie Thompson called "Learning Forgiveness." Holding onto grudges, anger and hurt feelings often keeps us from the awareness of being chosen and loved by God. Holding onto grudges, anger and hurt feelings also impedes our ability to recognize that others are chosen by God too.

During this holy season of Lent we are all invited to lean in, let go, learn forgiveness and rejoice in the reality that God has chosen us and loves us beyond anything we can imagine.

Displaced from their ancestral homes because of mining, militarization, and other forms of developmental aggression, the Lumads (indigenous people of the Philippines) have sought temporary sanctuary among hospitable communities. Global Ministries partner, Union Theological Seminary (UTS) has been privileged to host the Lumads. The Lumads stayed for a month at the UTS campus, which felt like home because of its beautiful natural surroundings. Through UTS' hospitality, the Lumad children were able to continue their education through the traveling Bakwit (evacuees) School, which provides schooling to the many Lumads who evacuated.

To the surprise of the seminary hosts, the Lumads/ strangers became their teachers. In the encounter, the seminary community experienced revelation and transformation.

Seeking to be faithful, as Jesus did, to prophetic boldness and compassionate witness, members of the UTS community, particularly seminarians, have now organized a regular Sunday Worship with a farmers' group that is occupying the nearby agricultural land. The Sunday Worship has been going on for some months now, with students coming home from the day's activity with unspeakable joy, a better understanding of God, and a stronger commitment to the least.

Foundation Facts

First Christian Church Foundation of Lincoln, Nebraska was formed July 31, 1964, for the purpose of obtaining and investing funds to be put for work for the support of programs of the church.

The bulk of Foundation funds are maintained as Undesignated Endowment. In 1973 a decision was made to contribute an annual pledge to the church from earnings of the Undesignated funds. This practice continues and the current pledge for 2019 is \$19,800. In addition, there are six designated funds — Pekar, Arnold, Hac, McMaster, Wood and Hofmann — payments from which are allocated for specific use upon request.

Contributions to the Foundation now most commonly come in the form of memorials upon the death of a member and bequests designated in wills.



Celebrating 150 Years with Notes from Our Past

From the February 21, 1919 issue of *The Church at Work*: "Last Sunday evening after a very delightful song service in which the choir and congre-

gation sang some of the songs familiar to the boys in the home camps and overseas services, Pastor H. H. Harmon continued the series of lectures in which he is relating the story of the war (WW1) as it came under his personal observation."

After a describing some of his experiences the article continues: "These Sunday night lectures are proving exceedingly popular. Last Sunday our auditorium (sanctuary), balconies and the Young Men's class rooms were crowded after chairs were placed in the rear of the auditorium. It was estimated that between two and three hundred people were turned away because they were unable to get into the services at all."
