June Act of Kindness Opportunity

The Gathering Place located at 1448 'E' Street will be the recipient of our June Collection Barrel. Now in



its 36th year, The Gathering Place is a program of Community Action and serves nearly 28,000 meals annually to those who face hunger in Lincoln. In 1984, two years after its opening, its founders recognized the growing problem of hunger, homelessness, and social isolation among lowincome people in Lincoln. To respond to this need, The Gathering Place transformed from a hospitality center into what it is currently - a soup kitchen. Evening meals are served Monday through Friday from 5:00 to 6:00 p.m., and bread and fresh produce are distributed two nights a week. This important work is made possible through the hard work and dedication of over 1,700 volunteers annually, and contributions from the community. Though its offerings have changed throughout the years, The Gathering Place is still very much a reflection of its original vision as a place where people from all walks of life can come together, converse, and if only for an hour or two, gather together as one.

Bulk food items are provided by the Food Bank of Lincoln, but other items needed to fulfill their mission at this time are:

- Metal forks and spoons
- 5 10 lb. bags of sugar
- Powdered coffee creamer
- Ketchup
- BBQ sauce
- Salad dressings for fresh lettuce salad (Ranch/Dorothy Lynch/ Italian)
- Paper towels
- Toilet paper
- New socks for men & women
- Deodorant
- Toothpaste
- Body and hand lotion

If this neighborhood resource for those needing a hand up sounds familiar, **The Gathering Place** was the recipient of our June Act of Kindness last year as well. Thanks for your support!



Here's some food for thought from the May 26, 1916 edition of *The Church at Work*:

Hens or Men

The inimitable Bert Wilson says: "Last year the members of the Christian Church averaged about forty cents apiece for Foreign Missions. In the large cities that is the price of a dozen eggs, and not always good eggs at that. Imagine a full-grown man standing at the altar of sacrifice and saying, 'Lord, here are twelve eggs; take these and evangelize the world.'

"The average Plymouth Rock hen will lay one hundred eggs a year, and many will lay over two hundred eggs a year. At this rate, the average hen would be worth more to the Kingdom of God than the average man.

"The Lord never put this world task upon our chickens, but it might be done more quickly if we would turn the financial part of it over to the hens. Which will it be, Hens or Men?"

Last year our congregation contributed nearly \$27,000 to a variety of outreach causes, and doesn't include contributions our Disciples Women make. So, it appears we heard Bert Wilson and responded favorably.
