
August Act of Kindness

September Act of Kindness

Our September 2019 Act of Kindness will be to overflow our Collection Barrel with **diapers** for The Bay, located at 2005 "Y" Street.

The Bay is housed in an old warehouse, a generous space that encompasses a nearly 30,000 square foot skate park, a coffee bar, a resource center, an all-ages concert venue, and state-of-the-art digital graphic art space. In theory, The Bay is a social services resource for teens—in particular, the impoverished, homeless, and exploited youth of Lincoln—but in practice, it's a place to hang out, enjoy a cup of coffee or tea, skate around, listen to music, and make art with your friends.

Mike Smith, the 32 year old founder, has built a small portfolio of businesses centered around educating youth and giving them safe spaces to be creative, sporty, and active. Simply put, Smith says "Young people need three things: somewhere to be, something to do, and someone to look out for them," alluding to his first venture in Nebraska, The Bay which is open 7 am to 7 pm Monday through Friday and 9 am to 5 pm on Saturday.

The Bay outreach starts with a core program, the All-Access Pass. Through scholarships distributed through public schools to 150+ low-income and at-risk youth, pass holders receive unlimited access to their community spaces (skate park, concert venue, and Café) — and their respective programming — as well as meals and mentoring. They develop skills, gain industry experience, and receive innovative, preventative family support created around assessing and building upon individual and family strengths. The Bay hosts three monthly food banks and provides an emergency pantry of diapers and personal hygiene products.

The Bay always needs a supply of disposable diapers to be given to young single mothers and low income, often homeless families that are part of their 'misfits' community. **Currently the emergency pantry is in need of the following size 4, 5, and 6 diapers.** If you haven't enjoyed a cup of artisanal coffee, tea or baked good at The Bay, you are missing out on a great treat.

Celebrating 150 Years with Notes from Our Past



From the August 29, 1919 edition of the Church at Work we found this article:

"Abraham Lincoln's Prediction"

At the time of general rejoicing in the triumph of the prohibition movement in America, it is well to recall the prediction made by Abraham Lincoln in the days when the movement was started, and which did so much to encourage those who have been working for it through the years of prejudice and inertia and active opposition till now at last it is fulfilled. "The liquor traffic," said that great American statesman, "is a cancer in society, eating the vitals, spreading destruction; and all attempts to regulate it will not only prove abortive, but will aggravate the evil. There must be no attempts to regulate the cancer. It must be eradicated - not a root must be left behind; for until this is done, all classes must continue in danger of becoming victims of strong drink . . . Slavery is abolished. The next question will be the overthrow of the legalized liquor traffic. In 1842 I predicted that the day would come when there would be neither a slave nor a drunkard in the land. I have lived to see one prediction fulfilled; I hope to see the other realized."
