STEPHEN MINISTRY

"There is no fear in love."

1 John 4:18a



"For you I am a bishop, with you, I am a Christian" St. Augustine

This quote comes from St. Augustine's sermon "On the Anniversary of His Ordination." Last week, I had the privilege of attending a retreat for pastors in which one of our presenters told us this quote. Gary Neal Hansen, formerly professor of Church History at University of Dubuque Theological Seminary, was one of our presenters at the Pastoral Leadership Revitalization Retreat I attended in Nebraska City. He is the author of a book entitled *Kneeling with Giants*: Learning to Pray with History's Teachers. He reminded us that although we are all called to be pastors, we are, first and foremost, Christians. During our retreat we were invited to ponder both facets of our lives. Like all Christians, we are invited to deepen and nurture our relationship with God. As pastors, we are called to facilitate the journey of faith for all those we shepherd.

This retreat was one part of the "Pastoral Leadership Revitalization" program (PLR), which is designed to increase pastoral resilience. It's being funded by a generous Lily grant and is made available through the Omaha Presbyterian Seminary Foundation. Its focus is to provide guidance, support, and mentoring to help us learn and grow in our role as a pastor. The PLR program involves a three-year commitment. During that time, I will receive monthly mentoring from a mentoring coach and I'll attend five retreats between now and the end of 2021. The first of those retreats was last week in Nebraska City at the Lied Lodge. In addition to participating in workshops and worship, I was assigned to and met my mentor/coach. The coaching I receive is valued at \$1000 per year, and the retreat costs will be approximately \$500 each. All of these costs will be covered by the grant, so this is a tremendous gift and opportunity for us all.

I am very excited to have been selected and invited to participate in the PLR, and I believe it will benefit not only me, but all of us. I look forward to sharing more information with you as this all unfolds, but for now, please keep me, all the pastors, mentors, and program staff in your prayers.

So as I close, let me borrow and adapt these powerful words from St. Augustine; "with you I am a Christian, for you I am a pastor." May God bring renewal and revitalization to us all.

A Note from Stephen Ministries

We Are Ambassadors for Christ

2 Corinthians 5:17-21 states, "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation: the old has gone, the new has come! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: That God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation. We are therefore Chris's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God. God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God."

This passage offers a wonderful insight into the role we Christians play in God's plan for bringing the world to himself. We are Christ's ambassadors. In so many ways we are called to take the place of Christ, to be Christ, for others around us. God will be calling some of you to be special ambassadors as Stephen Ministers, bringing the love and presence of Christ to those who are hurting and in need of care and support as they go through a hard time.

As a Stephen Minister, you are not thrown into ministry alone. You receive 50 hours of in-class training, with reading, discussion, and practice in how to support and help others effectively. You will participate in supervision and will receive continuing education. It won't be easy, but it will be joyful. You won't be tossed into deep water without knowing how to swim. No Stephen Minister is asked to do what he or she is not prepared to do. You will learn about the limits of confidentiality, how to pray with others, and how to set boundaries of care. You will also learn how to listen, step one of which is: Breathe through your nose.

You will meet once a week with your care receiver, not necessarily to solve his or her problems, and certainly not to cure them. God cures; you care, support, and pray. You are the disciplined friend who is present on God's behalf and in Christ's place, just to show concern for that person and his or her needs, not somehow to get your own needs taken care of. Does the idea of being a Stephen Minister stir you? Does your heartbeat a little faster? Does a sense of confidence well up in you that this is what God has gifted you to do?

We will be having a Stephen Ministry Information Night

on Thursday, October 24th at 6:00 in the Parlor. Come see, and hear what Stephen Ministry is all about. Do you feel God's tugging at you? I invite you to prayerfully consider whether God is calling you to be a Stephen Minister. Please let Pastor Karen or me know if you are interested in attending so we are sure to have enough refreshments for all. We look forward to seeing you Thursday, October 24th. Thank you for your prayerful consideration.


