They will not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain; for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the Lord as the waters cover the sea.

Isaiah 11:6-9

The season of Advent seems to be flying by all too quickly. It's hard to believe that Christmas Eve is less than 2 weeks away and that the year 2019 will draw to a close in just 3 weeks. As we move through this season and prepare for the New Year, we are invited to look at the world and our lives differently. The prophet Isaiah shared a vision of God's reign that lifted up the dream of a harmony and peace that encompasses the entire created order. As we move through Advent towards the beginning of 2020, we too are invited to ponder such a world. How would our lives and our world be different if we looked at things from the perspective of God's glory? How might we invite this vision of harmony and peace into our lives, our homes, and our congregation?

In my sermon on the 2nd Sunday of Advent, I cited a study entitled "How We Gather." Jill Duffield, editor of Presbyterian Outlook, mentioned this study and shared an internet link (<u>https://sacred.design/insights)</u> if you want to lean more. Thurston and ter Kuile, the creators of this study, discovered six consistent themes in places where Millennials often gather. I would synthesize this list down to 5:


Community Personal and Social Transformation Purpose Finding Creativity Accountability

I would like to suggest that we explore these 5 themes as a congregation. Any of these themes would have describe the Church at one time and, I believe, they could be descriptions of the Church once again. Creating a culture in which these themes are encouraged and developed will lead to the realization of the vision shared by the prophet Isaiah. As we develop and nurture these 5 qualities, we will be led closer to the harmony and peace lifted up in this holy season.

May God strengthen and guide us as we nurture these qualities in our own lives, in our community and in our congregation. May the harmony and peace of this season fill your lives, your homes, and our world.

January 2020 Act of Kindness

Again this January, our Act of Kindness Collection Barrel will support *Cedars Street Outreach & Youth Opportunity Center*, located at 318 S. 13th Street.

This programs seeks out runaway, homeless, and atrisk youth, ages 13-21, in our city. When they locate someone under a bridge, searching in a dumpster, or wandering the streets, they offer them a backpack full of items such as bottled water, non-perishable food items, personal hygiene products, blankets, and a safe place to get a hot meal during the week at the brick and mortar location.

Your Outreach Team has offered to collect <u>hats,</u> <u>scarves, gloves, mittens, socks, and hand/feet</u> <u>warmer packets</u> during the month of January. The director of the Street Outreach program was ecstatic to hear this, as last February, when the items we collected in January were delivered, it was one of the coldest days of the winter. The Opportunity Center turned into a 48-hour warming station for at -risk youth and Cedars put every item we donated to excellent use within four hours!

So, as you are finishing up your Christmas shopping, or out scouring the after Christmas sales, please pick up one or two of the items listed above and put them in the collection barrel in January.

Thank you for your generous support of our Acts of Kindness throughout 2018 and 2019! I have no doubt that in 2020, First Christian Church will continue to fulfill our mission of "Loving and Serving GOD by Loving and Serving Our Neighbors" through our monthly Act of Kindness.

FINANCE NOTES FRESH STARTS

One of the topics of conversation and concern at the Annual Congregational Meeting, held December 8th, was the budget shortfall in 2019 and the proposed budget deficit for 2020. As many of you have noticed, the 2020 budget was passed at the meeting with a full 16% of the budget, or just under \$40,000 unaccounted for. This is in addition to the \$20,000 that was never made up for 2019. That gives us a \$60,000 well to dig ourselves out of in 2020.

This deficit is coupled with a smaller amount of giving from previous years, and the 2020 stewardship campaign only made just over 70% of its goal. In year's past, First Christian has borrowed from other reserved funds to make up this difference, but these funds are depleting rapidly. At the current rate we are borrowing, our reserved funds will last roughly three more years.

There are several things you can do the help the financial future of the church. One is ordering SCRIP cards to make purchases. Talk to Donna R. after church any Sunday if you have questions about how SCRIP works. We also have a 5th Sunday Faith Giving opportunity once more this year on Sunday, December 29th. November brought in an impressive \$1,200. This will be an excellent chance to give one last gift.

As always, another way to help the future of the church, spiritually and financially, is inviting someone new to worship. This year FCC reached out to several community residences and businesses with Advent posters and postcards. There are extras around the church if you want to share with neighbors or coworkers, too.

Thank you for all that you do for FCC. We need everyone on board to have a fresh start in 2020!

"The large crowd at the services last Sunday night were certainly given a rare treat and a delightful hour and a half of genuine worship in the musical Christmas program presented by Mrs. H. J. Kirschstein and the chorus choir. Mrs. Kirschstein, at the organ, was assisted by Miss Edna Silsbee at the piano, and Miss Ruth Kirschstein and Mr. Charles Righter with violins. Never has the instrumental feature in our music been more helpful and pleasing, the stringed instruments contributing most beautifully. From the beginning to end, the solos, trios, and choruses were most pleasing and the Christmas hymns were sung heartily by the congregation. Mrs. Kirschstein had arranged for us some of the most beautiful of the old Christmas melodies as well as a number of the finest choruses from the 'Messiah'. It was really a wonderful night of song, filling our hearts with reverence for the Christ child."

Book Club News


Book Club will meet again **Friday January 10 at 6:30 pm** at D'Arcy Blosser's home. Our book for discussion is:



Mid-America region offers "Cane Ridge Re-Vitals" program

Starting in March, the Mid-America region has found a new way to help their more than 200 congregations connect with each other and their communities.

Regional Minister Rev. Ron Routledge has hosted six "Cane Ridge Re-Vital" events for congregations – spread out across Missouri, so no one drives more than 90 minutes to participate. Every participant is told to bring a "ministry item" to the event, and in an afternoon session, everyone shares the successful program that item represents. This idea-sharing helps neighboring leaders connect and brainstorm together.

From the first event, the region has created a worshipful setting for these congregations. The theme Scripture for the day is 2 Corinthians 3:18, and speakers reflect on the 1801 Cane Ridge Revival, at which, Routledge says, "Barton Stone said at the end of the experience, 'For a moment in time, we saw the face of God.""

The story of Cane Ridge is a powerful one for congregations who want to revitalize their ministry, Routledge explains, because "It was an awakening of a level playing field for a communion open to everyone...It's a reminder to drop the creeds and get back to the simplicity of following Christ."

Mid-America's Cane Ridge Re-Vital effort is a powerful example of the work regions do to strengthen congregational life across the U.S. and Canada. As Routledge celebrates, "Participants leave [this event] saying things like, 'I always thought a church our size couldn't do this kind of mission, but now I see we can!'...If people go away encouraged and equipped, that's a success in my book."
