# FINANCE NOTES SUR PLUS CELEBRATION!



As we reported in the last Messenger, 2019 Faith Giving topped out at over \$29,000. As you know, \$14,000 of this total was raised in December. The December giving was made up of 21 different families offering donations ranging from \$3,000 to \$30. What a show of loyalty and faithfulness to the church!

The latest news from the first 2020 Board Meeting, held Sunday, January 19th, is that this Faith Giving pushed the FCC budget to an over \$6,000 surplus!!! THANK YOU to all who pitched in to end 2019 in the black! The Finance Team would like to invite everyone for cake at coffee fellowship following service this Sunday, January 26th, to celebrate.

Our 2020 budget is going to rely on nearly \$40,000 of Faith Giving for us to break even. While 5th Sundays are a great time to make these contributions, if we can collect just over \$3,000 per month in Faith Giving, we would be on pace all year. Just some food for thought in

the months ahead.

In my Pastor's Corner for the first Messenger of 2020, I talked about the Benedictine pillars of stability, conversion, and obedience. In that article I focused on the pillar of stability. This time I would like to share some thoughts about the elements of conversion and obedience.

The Oxford Dictionary defines conversion as "The process of changing or causing something to change from one form to another." The Latin root of this word has to do with change. We often think of conversion as changing from one to faith to another or one faith tradition to another. It's often thought of as a one-time event.

For Benedict, conversion is about our growing desire to connect with God. For Benedict, conversion is about constantly turning to God in faith and trust. The Latin root of conversion is also the same root for the word conversation. Both words imply a willingness to be changed by our interactions with one another and with God. For Benedict, conversion and obedience are closely linked. Our Handbook for Benedictine Oblates states it well and clearly:

Obedience is part of our ongoing conversion, part of that constant turning to God that is conversion. Benedict begins his Rule with the verb "listen." Obedience, basically, is listening. It is hearing God's word to us.

As we begin a new year and a new decade, I invite us to embrace Benedict's invitation to listen and be continually changed. We are invited to listen to God, to converse with God, and to embrace the change that comes. Listening and genuinely conversing with God empowers us to do the same with one another.



FOR GLOBAL PEACE WITH JUSTICE

This year's event is April 24-27 in Washington, DC. The theme of the gathering is "Imagine! God's Earth and People Restored," and will focus on the intersection of the climate crisis and economic injustice. Registration is now open.

The first two days of the conference are filled with plenary sessions, keynote speakers, and a variety of workshops. On the third day, attendees visit Capitol Hill and meet with their Members of Congress advocating for the causes discussed and championed throughout the gathering. The event ends with a shared worship service.

At the 2020 event, Global Ministries will provide leadership for a plenary panel discussion on the global impacts of climate change, where conference participants will hear from local leaders around the world, including Global Ministries' partner organizations, about the impacts of climate change in their context and creative solutions to combat climate change.

This year's focus on climate change and economic injustice is of particular importance to Global Ministries, explains director of communications Beth Guy. "These are the things our partners care about. If they tell us these crises are urgent needs, then we should be responsive to those calls – that's our mission to work, listen, and share in life together. Advocating for change is a way to publicly be in partnership together, to say 'We hear you, we trust you, and we're here to walk alongside you."
