May Act of Kindness Food Bank of Lincoln

Due to Coronavirus, the month of May has become **Give to Lincoln Day**. This is a time when everyone in Lincoln is encouraged to make a donation to the nonprofit organizations that are crucial to the care, support, and spirit of our great city.

Our May Act of Kindness is to collect monetary donations for **The Food Bank of Lincoln**. We have all heard how this pandemic has substantially increased the number of people and families needing to secure food from our local food bank during this difficult time.

The Food Bank of Lincoln continues to monitor developments regarding the spread of COVID-19 in our community and their service area. The situation changes by the hour, and they have to adjust accordingly. They are committed to feeding neighbors facing food insecurity. COVID-19 forces them to shift their mindset about work they've done in the past and what needs to be done today to ensure they can continue to do as much good for as long as they can in the future. Their distribution plans continue to take shape quickly to ensure food-insecure neighbors across their 16-county service area have access to food.

So, every donation you make through our May Act of Kindness will be made by First Christian Church on their behalf. We will make the donation to the Lincoln Community Foundation on May 28th, which will have a bigger impact for the Food Bank. On this day, nonprofits also get a proportional share of a \$500,000 challenge match fund provided by Lincoln Community Foundation and their sponsors.

Times have changed. Help us provide hope and sustenance for neighbors who were strangers to hunger and are now accessing The Food Bank's services for the first time. Our local nonprofits need us now more than ever. As we move forward it is critical to have the above scripture before us. Undoubtedly, we all have our own ideas and opinions. The challenge will be taking all the resources before us and weighing what is best for everyone. What we have all done over the past couple of months, and continue to do now, has been to protect the most vulnerable in our midst. Physical distancing, sheltering in place, and wearing face coverings when going out have all helped minimize exposure to the virus. Love compels us to continue doing all the above as we strive to create a worship environment that praises God and provides a healthy and safe space for worshipers.

We are all treading a path never trodden and the situation changes daily, sometimes hourly. With all this in mind, it may be some time before we are able to come together confidently and safely. It is important that we remain steadfast and open to God's leading. While the path ahead may be unclear, we can be sure that we will come together again. Undoubtedly, we will all be changed by the new reality in which we live. However, there is much that we can take away from this experience that will deepen our life and faith. We have been invited to remember that we are part of a global community in which everyone is loved and cherished by God. We have been forced to ponder, what is it that makes us the church?

May we be guided by the God of love as we move forward and may we be given patience to move at God's pace, not ours.

March Act of Kindness Update



This is what \$560 worth of gift cards looks like!! Yes, First Christian donated all these gift cards to Voices of Hope on April 9th, along with ten tubes of toothpaste, six toothbrushes, and five liquid hand soaps from our Collection Barrel.

Voices of Hope has had to modify their services to take into account the health and safety of their clients and staff. They are not taking any walk-in services or groups to minimize exposure and spread of COVID-19. They are collaborating with local law enforcement to provide services during the closure.

On April 9th, I was assured that during this time our gift cards will be given out by local law enforcement to clients that Voices of Hope deem appropriate. Our March Act of Kindness will be making a difference in the lives of current and former victims of relationship violence, sexual assault, and all related forms of abuse during this unusual time of physical distancing. Thank God for our local law enforcement heros that are making our gifts available to those in need.

A new team has been created at First Christian Church. A Re-opening Team has been organized to discuss the steps necessary for First Christian to open up for public worship. Executive Committee Update

First Christian Church via the Executive Committee applied for and received a small business payroll protection loan. The loan is forgivable and is used for payroll and utility costs. It allows us to pay all of our staff as if we were operating under normal circumstances. It also allows us to expand our custodial hours for additional cleaning and disinfecting.
