Scripture *John 14:1-14*

¹'Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me. ² In my Father's house there are many dwelling-places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? ³And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also. ⁴And you know the way to the place where I am going.' Thomas said to him, 'Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?' 6 Jesus said to him, 'I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. ⁷ If you know me, you will know my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him.'

⁸ Philip said to him, 'Lord, show us the Father, and we will be satisfied.' ⁹ Jesus said to him,

'Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, "Show us the Father"? 10 Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own; but the Father who dwells in me does his works. 11 Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; but if you do not, then believe me because of the works themselves. 12 Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. ¹³ I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. ¹⁴ If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it.

Reflection

"Meditation for the 5th Week in Easter"

This passage from the Gospel of John is often chosen as one of the scripture lessons for funerals and memorial services. These words from Jesus bring comfort to those who are grieving. Even in the most distressing times of our lives, Jesus says "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me." We find ourselves in deeply troubling and uncertain times. What troubles your heart today? COVID-19 is on all our minds and has altered our lives and our world. How could we not be troubled? And yet, Jesus says "do not let your hearts be troubled." Jesus invites us to lay our troubles upon Him and embrace our belief in God. God is bigger than any virus. God remains faithful in all times and circumstances.

Our scripture lesson today also offers a challenge. Jesus reminds the early Disciples, and by extension us, that whoever has seen Jesus has also seen God the Father. Just as we are able to see God in Jesus, others are able to see Jesus through us. This seems particularly important in these days of COVID-19. It's so tempting to focus on ourselves and our needs and to seek to fulfill our desires, particularly in these times of selfisolation and physical distancing. There is a sense of urgency to reopen everything and get back to business. I'm as eager as anyone. But, our passage this week invites us to ponder our actions in light of this scripture. As we ponder our next moves, we must ask ourselves, how

will our decisions and actions be a reflection of God?

A colleague recently reminded me of the importance of empathy. We reflect the glory of God as we put ourselves in the place of another. As we face and name our fears and anxieties, we are able to acknowledge them in one another. We need not be overcome by those fears and anxieties because we have the promise of God's presence. As we strive to reflect Jesus in our lives and decisions, we are empowered to do so by the reminder that God has a place for each and every one of us. We reflect God's glory as we make decisions that care for ourselves and one another. This may lead us to continue physical distancing, remaining at home as much as possible, wearing masks when we leave home to run essential errands, and continuing to worship from home. The beauty of all this is that we show God's love for one another as we create safe places for all of us. God empowers us to do all this no matter how challenging it becomes. Hopefully, others will see the presence of our loving God through us and through the choices we make in the next few days and even months.

May we be empowered by God's promises to prepare a place for all of us. Our hearts need not be troubled as we place our belief and trust in God.
