

As we move from Pandemic to Protest, one element that disturbs many of us is the violence. Much to the surprise of those of us living in Lincoln, we have seen the outbreaks of anger and violence. The shocking destruction of property has been unnerving. As Greene's quote suggests, violence needs to be listened to and heard. It is shocking to consider, however, that violence can be an expression of great passion. There have been strong feelings expressed all around. Sadly, violence tends to push many of us away and we become unable to hear the message behind it. However, it is in our willingness to listen that we push aside indifference.

As one who lives near the church on the south side of the capitol, I experienced the violence too close and too personal. My immediate and gut response was fear. Once the violence subsided, the fear did as well. Following the destruction wrought in downtown Lincoln in the early hours of Sunday 31 May, I and many others chose to respond with a peaceful protest around the Capitol later that day. Inspired by "Black Lives Matter," many pastors from around the city joined others in emphasizing the importance of peaceful protest. However, it is still important that we hear all the voices inspired to speak out. Although it is uncomfortable for many of us, particularly those of white privilege, we must be willing to really hear those crying out for justice. To turn a deaf ear would be to respond with the indifference that Greene decries.

It is critical that we begin by listening, but we must move towards just action. When we celebrate the phrase "Love All" in our vision/mission statement, we take a stand for listening to and embracing justice. Our vision/mission statement also includes "show hospitality." As we listen to the passionate cries for justice, we are invited to show genuine hospitality and push indifference aside. It is tempting to turn away from the violence and cries for justice, but as people of faith we must lean in and listen. King reminds us that violence ultimately destroys everyone involved. How can we listen and foster genuine

dialog? I'm not sure, but I trust that here at FCC we will explore ways to be in dialog among ourselves and with others in our community.

May we truly be "A Movement for Wholeness in the Capitol Neighborhood" and beyond. If you have ideas about how we might proceed let me know and let's begin a conversation that brings true peace as we foster real justice for all. Empowered by God's love, may we continue to "Love All."

Book Club News


Book Club will meet again Saturday, June 27, 9:30 am at Susan Pallas-Duncan's home.

First Christian Church Reopening Expectations



As many of you know, First Christian Church reopened for public worship on Sunday, June 7th. The church staff, in cooperation with the Re-Opening Team, has developed a plan to make worshiping together as safe as possible. Some changes you will find around the building will be:

- Only the Chapel and Sanctuary doors will be open. NO entrance through the back doors. Even if you have a key or an access code, this door is off-limits. Keep this in mind when choosing where to park.
- Only the bathroom by the Chapel will be open. The fire doors to the hallway will remain closed.
- There will be NO access to the kitchen, parlor, nursery, or second floor. Even if you have a key to these areas, they are still restricted for the health and safety of the staff.
- The Sanctuary will be sanitized by Austin, our custodian, before and after worship.
- Hallway Hospitality volunteers will be assisting in sanitation during Worship, helping everyone maintain physical distancing, and monitoring traffic flow.
- Hand sanitizer will be available for all who attend.

There will also be changes made to Worship itself. Please note that at this time we will only be holding Worship. Sunday School, Worship & Wonder, and Coffee Fellowship will NOT be meeting during this time. The nursery will also remain closed. Some changes to expect during the service:

- We will require a face covering to join in Worship.
- You will need to get your own bulletin from the table in the Narthex. No one will be handing them
- We ask that you sit only with your family members. Different family groups will need to stay a minimum of 6 feet apart. Spaces will be marked in the Sanctuary to make this easier for everyone.
- There will be no communal singing. Music with either be instrumental or feature solo singers.
- We will not be "Passing the Peace" for the time being.
- Offertory plates will be set up in the Narthex and back of the Sanctuary. Please leave your offering there. We will not be passing offertory plates during Worship.
- We will not be celebrating communion for the time being.

We want to assure you that we are doing everything we can to make worship safe for you, your families, and the staff. Of course, if you still do not feel ready for public worship, we DO plan to continue our Weekly Worship Bulletins and Weekly Worship Videos. Please make the choices that are right for you and your health care situation. We pray that this may be a time of great celebration and a feeling of God present among us.
