## Scripture Reading

### Acts 4:32-35

<sup>32</sup> Now the whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common. 33 With great power the apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all. <sup>34</sup> There was not a needy person among them, for as many as owned lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold. <sup>35</sup> They laid it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need.

## John 20:19-31

19 When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' 20 After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. 21 Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' 22 When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. 23 If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.'

<sup>24</sup> But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. <sup>25</sup> So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord.' But he said to them, 'Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe.'

<sup>26</sup> A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' <sup>27</sup> Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.' <sup>28</sup> Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' <sup>29</sup> Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.'

<sup>30</sup> Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. <sup>31</sup> But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

### Reflection

### Meditation for the 2nd Sunday of Easter

### "Jesus is Still Persistently Present with Us"

So often when we hear or read this passage from the Gospel of John our minds flash to the title "Doubting Thomas." Perhaps it is because many of us relate to that character in the story. Like Thomas, many of us have struggled with periods of doubt and unbelief. As I began pondering this passage for today's sermon, I have to confess that is where my mind went. I thought of the most recent book by well-known author Brian McLaren entitled Faith after Doubt. But, as I continued to ponder this passage, I was reminded that the main character of this story is intended to be Jesus. This passage recounts the second resurrection appearance in this Gospel. After appearing to Mary, Jesus went to the Disciples.

Since our focus is generally on Thomas, we often miss some other key elements about this story. Jesus' presence addressed the fear and hostility that were present particularly for his Disciples and followers. Jesus' physical presence with the Disciples fulfilled earlier promises he made; Jesus repeatedly promised to remain with them even after his death. Jesus was present to them in a new and different way, but he was still present. Not only was Jesus physically present to them, which would have been enough, but he also brought peace, joy, and the Holy Spirit. Jesus came to them in the midst of their fear, anxiety, and sorrow. Jesus brought the promised companion and literally "breathes" in them the Holy Spirit. Just as God "breathed" the universe into being, so Jesus breathed into them the Holy Spirit.

Another striking feature of this story that I think is often overlooked is Jesus' persistence. When Jesus learned that one of the Disciples, Thomas, was not present during

this initial visit, Jesus returned to make sure that Thomas was included. Not only did Jesus return, but he presented the very evidence that Thomas said he needed. Once again, Jesus presented the physical evidence of his wounded hands and side. Jesus wanted to be sure that *all* the Disciples knew that he was the one who had been crucified days earlier. Jesus wanted to be sure that they *all* knew he had risen from the dead.

And now, we gather together on this 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Easter to remember and celebrate these same things. We are also mindful of the many promises Jesus made throughout his earthly life to remain present even, and especially, after his death. Last week we celebrated the realization of those promises as we came together for worship. We, like the Disciples, also come with our own fears, anxieties, and sorrows. Our Gospel lesson today reminds us that Jesus still brings peace, joy, and the Holy Spirit.

We live in fearful and anxious times. As we hopefully move towards the end of this global pandemic, we have been scarred by fear and anxiety. At times we may have wondered where God's Spirit was during these past months. It is in the midst of these fears and anxieties that Jesus continues to breathe in us the Holy Spirit of peace and joy. Perhaps the greatest message for us today is the reminder of Jesus' persistence. Jesus comes to us in ways that include us *all*. Jesus comes to us in various ways that touch each of us according to our need. Jesus brings new life to us all and to all creation.

Alleluia and AMEN!
