First Christian Church Foundation Notes

At its May 12, 2021 meeting the FCC Foundation met online with Elisabeth Andreason, our account manager with Morgan Stanley. Elisabeth reviewed the foundation's investments and answered any questions we had regarding the investments.

In addition to the Foundation's pledge to the church, the income from two specific funds was allocated for the following projects this year:

- From the Pekar Fund (part of the Foundation Account): Funds will be transferred to the church's property department to help pay for major boiler work which was done at the end of December.
- From the Hofmann Fund: Approved funding for Pastor Karen to attend a Leadership Training program at the end of August as well as to access training materials and peer coaches. Pastor Karen hopes that this training will help her with recruiting and developing leadership in our congregation.

The Foundation was pleased to learn of a bequest from the Bernie and Rose Dow estate that was received last fall. Pastor Karen has sent a letter of appreciation to the family as has the Foundation. This bequest and other memorial funds that have been given will go into the undesignated portion of the Foundation Account fund to build the endowment; interest and dividends from this fund are automatically transferred to the Foundation's checking account to underwrite our monthly pledge, bills for tax work and corporate registration, and any approved requests from the smaller designated funds. Hofmann Fund earnings are automatically reinvested and approved requests from the church are taken from the Fund itself.

Because the stock market has done so well over the last 8-10 years, the Foundation has grown. The Foundation Account holdings are in fixed income investments while the Hofmann Fund has a balanced allocation approach. The overall investment strategy is a conservative one which focuses on income earning but also protects the corpus of the investments. This strategy assures that gifts and bequests to the church will continue to provide income for the church and special projects for years to come. One of the benefits of an endowment is that it allows people to support the church even after they have passed on. The responsibility of the Foundation Board is to oversee, protect and grow this asset so that it will serve the church and her ministries now and for the future.

At the May meeting, the board members reviewed the 2020 tax return that has been filed and approved payment of the accountant fee. Our bi-annual non-profit corporation status has been renewed and registration fee paid. We have received older Foundation records with the turnover of officers which will be gleaned; important documents and mementoes will be kept in the church office.

Our next FCC Foundation meeting will be held on August 11, 2021 at noon; we hope to meet in person at that time.

Pastor's Corner

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.
--Romans 15.13

In the past I have been told that I am an optimist. I do not think it was meant as a compliment. When I read the following quote from the book *Change Your* World by John C. Maxwell and Rob Hoskins, I understood better why this comment troubled me. They began their book by exploring the foundational concept of hope. As I read this opening chapter, I better understood why I consider myself as a person of hope, not simply an optimist. Maxwell and Hoskins commented that hope is essential to the process of changing our world. They shared the following comments from Jonathan Sacks which appeared in his book The Dignity of Difference. Sacks commented that there is an important difference between hope and optimism. "Optimism is the belief that things will be better. Hope is the faith that, together, we can make things better. Optimism is a passive virtue, hope, an active one. It takes no courage to be an optimist, but it takes a great deal of courage to have hope."

As a person of faith, I really resonate with the concept of hope. I think I also struggled to see myself as an optimist because I tend to see things realistically, which does not seem to be part of an optimistic outlook. As I have been preparing our course in Spiritual Gifts, I have also been participating in the process of discernment. Although I was initially shocked, it ultimately made sense to me when I came to realize that one of my top spiritual gifts is "prophecy." It is not foretelling the future, but it is sharing the message of God that people need to hear. It also means becoming aware of what I need. One need that has become apparent to me is my need to become a better leader. This was not part of my preparation for ministry, but it is clearly a need now as I serve as your pastor.

I shared this awareness with the Pastoral Relations Committee and told them about a couple of options for leadership development. We all agreed that participation in the training offered by the John Maxwell Team seemed to be the best fit. Thanks to funds from my annual Continuing Education allowance from the congregation and a generous grant from the FCC Foundation, I was able to register for this program. So, as a part of this training I began reading *Change Your World*. It is my expectation and hope

that as I become a better leader I will be able to equip the leadership of this congregation.

One foundational element of this program that really attracted me was the emphasis on hope and positive change. Maxwell and Hoskins said it well: "The changes you make within yourself will give you the confidence and credibility and hope to help others." I believe this positive and hopeful attitude will empower me and you to move forward as individuals and as a congregation. I look forward to bringing you along as we make this hopeful, and not simply optimistic, journey.

The Apostle Paul said it well to the faithful in Rome and I repeat his words once again: "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."



See What's New with SCRIP



Are you tired of carrying all of those plastic gift cards? Do you find yourself at a store without SCRIP? Are you a SmartPhone user? Has COVID-19 prevented you from buying SCRIP?

Now you can purchase Scrip anytime you need it, anywhere, right from your phone! Scrip is literally at your fingertips for gas, clothing, home goods, honey-do projects, and even those late night Amazon shopping excursions! You can even ask your shopper friends and family to enroll!!

Shop With Scrip has just gotten easier as they recently created a free app called **RaiseRight** available at both Apple's App Store and Google Play. You'll be prompted to enter our enrollment code, available in the FCC Office, and then to create your personal family ShopWithScrip account. If you were already using the mobile website, MyScripWallet, all of your information and Scrip will automatically be transferred to the RaiseRight app.

Most of the vendors offer a choice of an eGift card or physical plastic gift card. Many of the physical gift cards are reloadable, meaning you can add money to them rather than buying a new card. To use the eGift or reloadable gift cards you must sign up for their online payment program PrestoPayTM which lets you pay for your mobile orders by securely linking your bank account to your ShopWithScrip account. For a nominal 15 cents per order, PrestoPay connects to your bank account and withdraws the money. A credit card can also be used with a 2.6% fee added. If ordering only plastic gift cards, you can continue to pay Donna Ruhl by check or green electronic transfer form. All orders (paper and online) for physical cards are sent monthly after the first Sunday of the month.

Please note gift cards for local vendors such as Super Saver, Hy-Vee, Russ's, Runza, etc. are not available using the app and must be ordered from Donna.

Pentecost - Was there every a greater birthday?

The Apostle Paul calls the church "the body of Christ," and each person "individual members of it" (1 Corinthians 12:27-28). This body of Christ, born at Pentecost where the gift of the Spirit was first received, is where "to each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good" (1 Corinthians 12:7).

The effective work of the church and the gifts for the ministry and mission of the body are tasked to the individual members. Each member is a significant part of the body. Each one has the responsibility and the flame.

Pentecost - the church's birthday - is perhaps the best day to share the gift of the Holy Spirit by supporting the mission and ministry of FCC through Faith Giving.

Faith Giving is necessary to support and sustain the basic operation and ministries of First Christian Church every week. A monthly average of \$65 per family is all it would take to meet our 2021 Faith Giving goal. As of May 16, we have received \$6,044 in Faith Giving.
