Ephesians 1:3-14

³Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, ⁴ just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. ⁵He destined us for adoption as his children through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, ⁶ to the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. ⁷ In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace ⁸ that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and insight ⁹he has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, ¹⁰ as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth. ¹¹ In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, ¹² so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory.¹³In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; ¹⁴ this is the pledge of our inheritance towards redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

Reflection Meditation for 7th Sunday after Pentecost

"Destined for Adoption" by Pastor Kelly Tyrrell, Guest Preacher

The themes I want to talk about today come from verses 4 and 5 from the letter to the Ephesians. "Just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. He destined us for adoption as his children through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will." First, I wanted to take a moment with the idea of predestination. It is certainly not a new one, and people feel a lot of different ways about it. Most people have heard of this from Calvinism, for whom the concept of predestination was foundational. John Calvin and his followers very much believed that some people were predestined by God for salvation and ultimately heaven. This seems to fall in line with our scripture today. However, they also believed that there were others who were predestined, before the foundation of the world as they say, for damnation and ultimately hell. This concept should give us major pause. I am one to believe that God is good, and that God believes their creation is good (remember, they said so in Genesis). So why would God foreordain some people to hell? It doesn't add up. And the scripture today, I don't think Paul is coming to that conclusion either. Paul's mission was to unite Jews and Gentiles into one church of Christ. He was saying everyone was predestined to be holy, not just a select few.

As I gave this some thought, I think while God may not predestine us for hell, we sure can predestine ourselves for a kind of hell on earth. I think we have all lived through seasons of a hell of our own making, not knowing, or not trusting that God has truly chosen us for heaven. Maybe your personal hell is a job that you hate but never had the guts to leave. Maybe it is staying in an unhealthy relationship too long not knowing how to get out. I think some people live through the hell of addiction or mental health problems not seeking help because they don't feel worthy of it. All of these hells, they are a lie of our own making. We are not predestined to live like this. As Paul says to us, we were chosen by God in Christ. Chosen, by God! How much more worthy can you get? I think this can be hard to believe or trust, it sounds too good to be

true, so we need practice on that.

Second, the theme of adoption is one that stood out to me for very personal reasons. I am adopted. I was adopted when I was a week old and I lived with my adopted parents ever since. I have never met my biological parents. I wonder sometimes if I was destined to be adopted, destined to be a product of the circumstances of my birth. My mom, Bridget, she found herself in a precarious situation when she turned up pregnant in the 11th grade. And as I understand it, their family relationship was forever fractured after my birth. Imagine being the worst thing that ever happened to someone.

But, on the flip side, I am also the best thing that has happened to someone, namely my adopted parents. I was adopted into the best family any child could ever ask for. I have learned so many life lessons from my parents, not so much from lecturing but from their living example. I am so proud to be their child. It is as though God knew exactly who my parents were supposed to be. God knew that these were the people with whom I would become the woman I have become. God knew that is was with these people that I would flourish and grow.

This is how I view our scripture today, that we are all adopted as God's children through Christ. God knew the best parent for us: God. It is with God that we will flourish and grow. We are all adopted, and all means all. No longer are we to be limited by the circumstances of our birth. No, this is an open offer, open to all of those who desire to follow in the ways of Jesus. It is a fulfilment of our destiny. This is a way of us living into the fullness of life that God always intended for us, always, since before the foundation of the world. May we no longer create miniature personal hells on earth. Let us truly believe that God's good pleasure and will wishes nothing but the best for us. May we feel truly adopted into God's family as their children through the never ending love and grace of our Lord, Jesus Christ.
