Reflection

Meditation for 8th Sunday after Pentecost

"The Trouble with Tribbles" by Wayne Duncan

The Tribbles have troubles. Troubles from all sides. The trouble with Tribbles wasn't that they were different, but rather that they were misunderstood and disregarded. But still the Tribbles pressed on and enjoyed being Tribbles.

This is a good example for us as humans. Humans have a history and a purpose. We humans, like the Tribbles, forge on regardless of our circumstances. We enjoy being created as humans.

There have been times when we all have felt slighted and marginalized, maybe even misunderstood or taken for granted. Maybe we have even felt forgotten. But, we can take heart, for God is seeking us! In the Gospel reading for today, we see God seeking the one who has gone astray. We may rest in the hope, that even if we have gone off the path, God is seeking us. In our Psalm, we experience the shepherd providing, leading, and comforting. "With goodness and mercy following us all of our days, we shall dwell in the house of the Lord forever."

A 14th century writer named John Ruusbroec challenges us to "see" people in the way that Jesus invites us to do. Not to "see" with your physical eyes, but to "see" with your spiritual eyes. Using the powers of memory, understanding, and the will as sources of spiritual life, we can gain "sight" into people's lives and the world around us. To "see" someone without physical eyes, we open ourselves up to a much more meaningful experience of sharing and getting to know someone, with "No Eyes."

"Seeing" others through our spiritual eyes prevents them from feeling forgotten, slighted, or marginalized. It can be our way of seeking after them just as God seeks after us. After all, the Tribbles don't even have eyes! And yet they still give love. The Tribbles don't see and still accept others. May we love others even when they don't look like us. May we accept others even when they don't do things the way we do. May we seek after them as our family in God.

We serve a loving God and our God loves all. May we always respond, reset, and recapture all the love God has to offer us. May we seek to see each other with "No Eyes."
