Scripture Reading

1 Samuel 1:4-20

⁴On the day when Elkanah sacrificed, he would give portions to his wife Peninnah and to all her sons and daughters; ⁵ but to Hannah he gave a double portion, because he loved her, though the LORD had closed her womb. ⁶ Her rival used to provoke her severely, to irritate her, because the LORD had closed her womb. ⁷ So it went on year after year; as often as she went up to the house of the LORD, she used to provoke her. Therefore Hannah wept and would not eat. ⁸ Her husband Elkanah said to her, 'Hannah, why do you weep? Why do you not eat? Why is your heart sad? Am I not more to you than ten sons?'

⁹ After they had eaten and drunk at Shiloh, Hannah rose and presented herself before the LORD. Now Eli the priest was sitting on the seat beside the doorpost of the temple of the LORD. ¹⁰ She was deeply distressed and prayed to the LORD, and wept bitterly. ¹¹ She made this vow: 'O LORD of hosts, if only you will look on the misery of your servant, and remember me, and not forget your servant, but will give to your servant a male child, then I will set him before you as a nazirite until the day of his death. He shall drink neither wine nor intoxicants, and no razor shall touch his head.'

¹² As she continued praying before the LORD, Eli observed her mouth. 13 Hannah was praying silently; only her lips moved, but her voice was not heard; therefore Eli thought she was drunk. 14 So Eli said to her, 'How long will you make a drunken spectacle of yourself? Put away your wine.' 15 But Hannah answered, 'No, my lord, I am a woman deeply troubled; I have drunk neither wine nor strong drink, but I have been pouring out my soul before the LORD. 16 Do not regard your servant as a worthless woman, for I have been speaking out of my great anxiety and vexation all this time.' ¹⁷Then Eli answered, 'Go in peace; the God of Israel grant the petition you have made to him.' ¹⁸ And she said, 'Let your servant find favor in your sight.' Then the woman went to her quarters, ate and drank with her husband, and her countenance was sad

¹⁹They rose early in the morning and worshipped before the LORD; then they went back to their house at Ramah. Elkanah knew his wife Hannah, and the LORD remembered her. ²⁰ In due time Hannah conceived and bore a son. She named him Samuel, for she said, 'I have asked him of the LORD.'

Hebrews 10:11-14, 19-25

¹¹ And every priest stands day after day at his service, offering again and again the same sacrifices that can never take away sins. ¹² But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, 'he sat down at the right hand of God', ¹³ and since then has been waiting 'until his enemies would be made a footstool for his feet.' ¹⁴ For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are sanctified.

¹⁹ Therefore, my friends, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus, ²⁰ by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh), ²¹ and since we have a great priest over the house of God, ²² let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. ²³Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. ²⁴ And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, ²⁵ not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

Reflection

Meditation for 25th Sunday after Pentecost
"Pleading with God"
written by Pastor Leigh Lestina

Have you cried out to God lately? Have you experienced heartache, to the point that your only hope was the God of Israel, the God at Christ's side, the God of Hannah? Because I bring good news! Jesus, the resurrected Christ, is a listening God. We have God on our side – all of our sides.

Through addiction, through loneliness, and through many traumatic experiences – one after another – my mom never stopped crying out to God. Even if she couldn't name this God and identify them, she never gave up on the idea that there wasn't *some* sort of God watching over her and helping her as much as they could.

Hannah, one of the many women named in the Hebrew Bible, felt the same way. Imagine her situation – her sister wives birthed many children – many of them possibly sons – and yet she remained barren. Our Hebrew author of this section blamed God for closing her womb, as many people in ancient times thought God was in control of closing and opening the chance for male children.

What is the key between these two women? Both Hannah and my mom trusted the Lord. After both were accused of substance abuse, one got clean and has been sober for six years. Another brought a consecrated child to the Temple of the Lord as an answer to her prayer. But do you want to know what

makes all of this prayer possible? Just as Eli opened the door for Hannah's prayer to be answered, we have our own priest – this Jesus – that advocates on our behalf and says "Go in peace; the God of Israel [will] grant the petition you have made to him."

As Disciples of Christ, we do not just stand with our hands clasped in prayer at God's presence. We move from there, with God still ever-present at our side, clasping our neighbor's hands as they suffer and cry out to God. We do not walk alone as Christians. Indeed, we walk with Jesus – all of us together – as we journey from God's presence within our own hearts, to our hands and feet, and eventually to our neighbors in need. God does not leave us comfortless when we are aching. Rather, they hear our cries and group us with our neighbors to share the burden and to lighten the load. This is our duty as Christians – not only to know God is listening, but to then listen as our Messiah speaks peace and comfort in and through us, and out into the world. God truly hears us pleading to them, and while we wait for whatever answer that may be, we are not left comfortless. Indeed, we are basked in the presence of Christ incarnate – the Church. Maybe Hannah and my mom felt that, too.
