## Pastor's Corner

One of my favorite poets Ann Weems wrote a poem that sums up the experience of Holy Week. Her poem "Holy Week" begins:

Holy is the week...
Holy, consecrated, belonging to God...
We move from hosannas to horror
With the predictable ease
of those who know not what they do
Our hosannas sung
Our palms waved
Let us go with passion into this week.

Her poem resonates for me as we prepare to enter what I would venture to call the "holiest" of weeks in the church year. It can be so tempting to make the jump from Palm Sunday directly to Easter without passing through the events commemorated on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. We want to pass from the entry into Jerusalem to the glorious exit from the tomb without stopping in the Garden of Gethsemane or standing at the foot of the cross.

Throughout this Lenten season we have been led through the wilderness by Dana Trent with the expectation of discovering the gifts that arise from the journey. It is human nature to avoid pain and discomfort, but such avoidance robs us of the depth that those experiences can bring. The same is true for Holy Week. It is uncomfortable to listen to Jesus' plaintive prayer in the Garden. It is also excruciating to stand at the foot of the cross as Jesus dies. And yet, these events bring depth to the experience of new life that comes on Easter Sunday.

I realize many people do not have the day off on Good Friday, but we schedule our service over the lunch hour to enable as many people to attend as possible. If this will not work for you I urge you to join us on Maundy Thursday where we will move through the events that led to the cross. We will gather for a light supper before the service. Following our meal we will gather for The Lord's Supper and a Service of Shadows in which we re-live the events of Jesus' final hours of his incarnate presence. Whether you are able to attend these services or not, you are invited to continue the journey with Dana Trent through the devotional *The Gifts of Spiritual Wilder*ness. As is our custom here at FCC, you are also invited to participate in our 24-hour prayer vigil. This can be done here at FCC or in your own home. If you have not had an opportunity to do this before, this year might be a great time to dive in.

There are a variety of ways to make Holy Week a truly holy time of prayer, worship, and reflection. You will soon receive a postcard highlighting the events here at FCC during this holy time of year. We look forward to being a part of your journey as we all participate in the procession into Jerusalem, pass through the Garden, stand under the cross, and enter the empty tomb.

# The General Board has Begun the Process for Re-Electing the General Minister and President

The General Board of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) has begun the process for reelecting the General Minister and President, Rev. Teresa "Terri" Hord Owens. In a letter to Moderator Belva Brown Jordan, Hord Owens wrote,

"I continue to feel the call of God to serve as GMP. Having now served for 4-1/2 years, two of those in the midst of a pandemic, I want to continue to walk with Disciples as we together imagine who we must be as church in order to help make real the reign of God's kindom on earth. And in declaring my desire to be considered for re-election, I re-commit myself to use my gifts in leadership and service to this church, which I so dearly love."

The process for re-electing a General Minister and President is outlined in the Standing Rules for the General Board, section 9. Following this process, the Administrative Committee, meeting virtually in executive session in February 2022, voted to initiate the re-election process and identified members of the Review/Search and Call Committee. The committee was then confirmed by the General Board at its February 2022 meeting.

Over the next year, the Review/Search and Call Committee will continue to follow the process outlined in the Standing Rules, gathering information from across the church. The Administrative Committee will receive the report of the Review/Search and Call Committee when it meets April 2023 and will vote to confirm or not confirm the re-election of the current General Minister and President.

## Refugee Resettlement Update

By the time you read this, the Ghaousdin Meshwani family will have been in their home for two weeks. In that time, they have gone to appointment after appointment: health department lab work, wellness checkups, job fairs, the grocery store, WICS signup, and interviews. For volunteers and family alike, it's been a busy two weeks. Ghaousdin and Razia attend an online ELL class and we are looking for a close-by inperson class to help move them progress learning English. Their native language is Pashto which looks a lot like Arabic and is read from right to left. Learning English for them will be as much of a challenge as attempting to learn Pashto would be for us - difficult at best. Having Ghaousdin's brother and family living just a few blocks away is a bright spot for them - Jalaladin knows just a little more English and that has helped us all!

First Christian folks currently approved and working directly with the family are Tom Mason, Carla Pinneo, and Jim & D'Arcy Blosser. Lindsay Swanson helped us to get internet service in the house for the online classes. (John and the girls came along and we all enjoyed food shared by the family.) Pastor Karen is completing the paperwork to assist. Many of you contributed items to outfit their household. FCC has provided grocery gift cards with money contributed for the family. Folks from other Disciples churches in Lincoln are actively involved - Southpointe, Edenton, Southview, Bethany, Trinity Chapel, and Crossbridge.

It's been "all hands on deck" for the mentoring team and will be for the next few weeks. Thank you to our congregation for your generous gifts toward providing a safe home for this family!
