Reflection

Meditation for the 2nd Sunday of Easter

"Building a House of Faith"

"And Jesus said unto the theologians, 'Who do you say that I am?' They replied, 'You are the eschatological manifestation of the ground of our being, the kerygma of which we find the ultimate meaning in our interpersonal relationships.' And Jesus said, 'What?'" Welcome to Seminary; schools across the world creating a new generation of theologians using words even Jesus wouldn't understand. I am graduating in less than a month, and I still don't get all the \$50 words they use here. But what am I doing in Seminary if I can't turn my education into something meaningful for you? My goal is to help you encounter God for yourself. I want to empower you to become a theologian just like the smarty-pants at my school.

Theology is the study of God, and by study, I mean "the devotion of time and attention to acquiring knowledge" about God. Think about all the ways in which you are already doing this. You are already a theologian, even if you don't know it yet. But in our Christian tradition, we don't only think about God. God is only the beginning. We think about our neighbors and friends being made in the image of God, and we think about Jesus.

We probably think about Jesus as the Christ just as much as we do about God, maybe even more, especially at this time of year! Then thinking about Jesus leads us to think about the disciples and ourselves as followers of his way. To make following a little easier, we create groups, called the church, where we strive to live out Jesus's mission for us in our own time and place. When we think about church, I ask, doesn't a church feel much better when it's inspired? Filled with the Spirit? So, how do we feel about the Holy Spirit? Does the Holy Spirit rush in like a mighty wind? Glide over us like a gentle dove? Our study of God is connected to so many more thoughts about our faith. It's like a chain or one of those brainstorming webs. You could say it's like constructing a house. Our House of Faith is built floor by floor until you have "constructed" a theology. It's really this simple. (Don't tell the Seminary!) We are thinking about different elements of God and faith in a way that creates a cohesive thought pattern. Thinking about religious ideas in this linked way is helpful to discern what you truly believe or don't, what is essential to your faith, and what is just window dressing.

When I created my personal theology for school, my House of Faith, I called it a "Theology of Emmanuel" or "God with Us." God's love for us and relationship with us is the core of who God is. So, when we say that we are made in the image of God, I would say we are made to love and be in relationship with one another. But, as we all know, sometimes these connections get broken, or we are so selfrighteous, we refuse to be in relationship at all. To fix this, we need a Jesus to empower us to live authentic lives. We need a Jesus who has walked in our shoes, understands our pain, and stands beside us in our suffering.

As followers of Jesus, this means we need to stand by one another as well. When we join together in churches, we must love our neighbors and care for their needs. Churches shouldn't just be "about" Jesus, they should be "of" Jesus, carrying his mission forward into the world.

But you know, that's just me. It's a little pie-in-the-sky, but this kind of thinking about God feels true to my soul. What feels true to you? When it comes to having faith in our risen Lord, only you can decide what you believe. Only you can build your House of Faith. Continue to think about God.
