'Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest.²⁹Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.³⁰For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.' Matthew 11:28

As we move to the end of the school year I suspect many of you are weary, I know I am. We've made it through the major holidays of Christmas and Easter and all that goes with them. We concluded our Wednesday evening activities for the summer. Once we move through Memorial Day weekend and celebrate Pentecost on the first Sunday of June we'll officially be in summer mode. The summer holds time off for many of us as we plan for vacations and time away. Perhaps man of you are like me, eager to see the slower pace of summer begin. The past year has been particularly challenging as we continue to struggle with all the issues around the global pandemic. While eager to resume life as it was two years ago, we still have to acknowledge that COVID is not completely in the rear view mirror. In many ways, living in this twilight time of COVID is almost more exhausting. We've resumed many of the activities from our pre-COVID life, but everything still looks a bit different. In the midst of things we are still keenly aware of the danger that still lurks. We still learn of many people who are battling the virus or have done so in recent days or weeks. The possibility of contracting the virus is still ever present.

We also have to acknowledge the many ways in which life has changed. Occasionally, we have had well attended services, but for the most part our numbers have dwindled. Live streaming has enabled us to reach out to those unable to attend in person, but sometimes it makes it easier to stay at home and worship in our pajamas or sweats. It is difficult to get back into the habit of attending worship and meetings in person. Sadly, for many, health concerns also prevent participation in church life in ways that were possible before. The weight of all these components makes the weariness even more burdensome. Things are not as they once were and probably will not be that way again. As if this were not enough, many of us are burdened by the struggles in the world today. The war in Ukraine, dire economic predictions, rampant inflation and escalating costs. There is a lot to weigh us down and deepen our sense of weariness.

Although the details of our life are unique to our time and situation, the experience of weariness is not. Jesus spoke to those in his time who were weary too. They may not have faced a global pandemic, but many were burdened by some of the same kinds of issues. Those who came to hear Jesus faced health concerns. financial worries, dire economic warnings, violence and wars. Just as Jesus spoke to those people long ago he speaks to us today through scripture. Jesus continues to invite the weary and those with heavy burdens to come to him. We are still invited to share our weariness, our fears and our burdens with Jesus. We are reminded that as we lay our weariness and burdens upon him we will find rest. As we roll into the summer months we are invited to take time for such rest. Hopefully embracing the res that Jesus brings will also bring a sense of renewal. I know my plan is to do that very thing, to take some vacation and enjoy the slower pace of summer. I hope Jesus' invitation to lay our weariness and burdens upon him so we can find the rest and renewal he brings.

PENTECOST – Was there ever a greater birthday?

After his resurrection, Jesus appeared to his disciples and was with them for 40 days, before ascending to heaven. While with them, he said: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. For John baptized with water, but in a few days, you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit" (Acts 1:4-5).

Ten days later, Jesus' words were fulfilled, on the day of Pentecost. Pentecost is considered the birthday of the Church, for it was on this day, that the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles and filled them with the gifts needed to lead the Church. This was the start of the church's mission to the world.

Pentecost – the church's birthday – is perhaps the best day to share the gift of the Holy Spirit by supporting the mission and ministry of FCC through Faith Giving.

Faith Giving is necessary to support and sustain the basic operation and ministries of First Christian Church every week. A monthly average of \$65 per family is all it takes to meet our 2022 Faith Giving goal. So far this year, we have received a total of \$2,606 in Faith Giving.

Afghan Family Resettlement

The Lincoln Disciples Afghan **Resettlement Team has been busy** taking family members to appointments and, especially, helping Ghaousdin, his brother Jalaladin, and now a "cousin", Husann, find jobs. Tom Mason has spent hours with the men and finally was able to report that they will begin their jobs officially with Kawasaki this week. They attended orientation on Thursday and Friday of last week. Lutheran Family Services (LFS) completed their 90-day support of the Meshwani family in mid-April. We are finding that we need to stav in much closer touch with the family, especially watching the mail in order to make sure they are responding to all the DHHS correspondence as well as keeping on top of any bills. Through May, LFS is taking care of bills; the Lincoln Disciples Team will assist with June bills while Ghaousdin begins work and until income comes in. We'll work with him on budgeting and having a bank account. Carla Pinneo, Jim and D'Arcy Blosser have provided transportation to medical appointments in the last month as have team members from other Lincoln churches. Language continues to be a challenge but Ghaousdin is making some progress; Google translate is still our friend. We've made progress with enrolling the two older children in LPS (Kindergarten next fall for Heena and Preschool for Mohammad Younes). We'll work next on in person English classes for both Ghaousdin and, especially, Razia.

A huge THANK YOU to Tom who has spent many hours working with the job applications, job fair, job orientation, interfacing with prospective employees, and helping the men to understand the ins and outs of employment!

News from the First Christian Church Foundation

The FCC Foundation Board met on May 11, 2022 via Zoom. We were joined by **Elisabeth Andreason with Morgan** Stanley to bring us up to date on how our funds are invested and the protections in place to protect the principal as well as continue to generate income for the support of FCC and special projects. While we are experiencing a downturn in the market right now, she reported that, over time, there is no reason to worry about the current change in market value. In November we reported that funds had been approved for the purchase of new microphones which were requested by the Worship and Praise Team. The microhpones have been purchased in installed and will provide a much better quality of sound. In addition to this allocation, final reimbursements for tuition and books for fall and spring semesters were presented to our seminarians in residence on May 15 as their internships at FCC have concluded. Both of these allocations were made possible through the Hofmann Fund. Record-keeping – historical and current was discussed at our May meeting and we will work in the next few months on consolidating all of the records that have made their way into the church office. These records will always be open for anyone in the congregation to review. FCC visitors are also welcome to attend foundation board meetings. (If we are meeting by zoom, you will need to let someone on the Foundation know that you would like to attend.) Our next meeting will be on August 10, 2022 at noon.



Kamp Kaleo is just around the corner!! There are still openings at each of the camps. And through an anonymous donor, every camper that registers between now and camp starting dates automatically receives a \$100 scholarship. With First Christian paying for ½ of camping fees, that means that for a week-long camp, the cost would be \$162.50 per camper. For Little Kampers the cost would be \$25 per camper/adult.

This summer's curriculum theme is "What's in a Name?". Utilizing scriptures from Exodus, Luke, Ruth, Genesis and Matthew, we'll explore "how names take on meaning beyond the spoken syllables. Our attempts to name God show the relational power of names and remind us that no name will fully encompass God. We also try to name ourselves in ways that give meaning or make sense of the world. As we reflect on the stories, the names of characters, and the names of those who have shaped us, we are comforted by a God who is bigger than all our questions.We go out to serve in the name of God, who empowers us to name every moment and every place as holy ground."

Week long camps begin on Sunday afternoon with check-in between 3 and 4 p.m. and end on Friday at 1 p.m. The weekend Little Kampers begins with check -in between 3 and 4 p.m. on Friday and ends on Sunday at 1 p.m.
