Scripture Reading

Psalm 148

Praise the Lord! Praise the Lord from the heavens; praise him in the heights! Praise him, all his angels; praise him, all his host!

Praise him, sun and moon; praise him, all you shining stars! Praise him, you highest heavens, and you waters above the heavens!

Let them praise the name of the Lord, for he commanded and they were created. He established them for ever and ever: he fixed their bounds, which cannot be passed.

John 13:31-35

³¹When he had gone out, Jesus said. 'Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in him. ³²If God has been glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself and will glorify him at once. 33Little children, I am with you only a little longer. You will look for me; and as I said to the Jews so now I say to you, "Where I am going, you cannot come." 34I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. ³⁵By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.'

Reflection

Meditation for the 5th Sunday of Easter "Blessings Amidst Mental Adversity"

Jesus, before he was betrayed and sent to the die on the cross, must have felt some kind of anxiety. We hear elsewhere in the Gospels that Jesus even asked God, if God could, to take away the cup of suffering.

Just like Jesus, we might face great anxiety. During the pandemic, mental illness worsened for many people. But there is good news in all of this: God is with us. God does not abandon us, nor forsake us. In fact, God turns all that we suffer into a blessing – in some fashion or another.

Let me tell you this: God is with us, no matter the circumstances, no matter the trials. God does not abandon us, nor forsake us. God did not even forsake Jesus in his time of trial, even when Jesus later felt alone on the cross. God truly will always be with us, and like Jesus, we might feel alone in some parts of our lives or another, but that does not change God's love for us.

Considering Jesus' context for the Gospel passage for today, Jesus foretells his betrayal by Judas, and then afterward, foretells Peter's denial. But right in the middle of telling his disciples of what they'll do to him, he tells him this weird thing: "Everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." When Jesus is facing a great and terrible death with his friends abandoning and

betraying him, he turns to them and says, "love one another." Love each other during this great time of trial, because you will need each other. Nobody can face any great trial alone – we need each other. And when we help one another, we can go forth from the Table of God with love at our side and praises coming from our lips, praising God for all that God has done, blessing us in all of our circumstance with each other. We cannot do it alone. This is why we are the Church: to edify, to love, to bear one another's burdens, and to praise God for all they've done in the meantime. Let us go forth from the Table, to cherish and adore one another amidst our mental health adversities, and then to cherish and adore one another in our communities. We can do that, blessing one another with God at our side.
