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# Merry Christmas From..

The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. John 1:1-5

The opening verses of the Gospel of John, the Prologue, has been one of my favorite biblical passages throughout my life. I had the opportunity to do a "deep dive" into this text during college and it has remained special to me since then. As many of you know, the final verse of this passage is my favorite section. These words have guided me through some pretty tough times throughout my life. These words gave me strength as I weathered a period of deep depression in my late twenties. They continue to guide me now as I face new challenges in my life and ministry. As many of you read this you have probably seen my letter to the congregation regarding my upcoming medical leave. As I approach my mid 60's I find myself facing unforeseen health challenges. I could power through one or two health challenges, but it seems that I do not have the strength to power through them all. As I deal with diminishing vision I need more time to learn new skills. Dealing with my orthopedic and back problems has added a layer of difficulty that I must deal with as well. I no longer find myself able to serve you faithfully in body, mind and spirit. So, I am taking some time to rest and heal. It feels like a dark time for me, but I know God's light will also overcome this period of darkness.

As I have mentioned before, I believe that there is often a "parallel process" at work. Many of you in the congregation may also feel this is a dark time. Things are not as they once were. Like my physical body that impedes my ability to do the things I want, many of you may sense frustration that the congregation no longer seems able to do what it feels called to do. As I take this time away to rest and heal, I invite the congregation to do the same. Those in leadership will be busy filling in the gaps, however, this can also be a time of rest and renewal as things are done differently. Others will fill the pulpit and leaders will fill in the pastoral care gaps. While it would be easy to get discouraged, to be overcome by the darkness, we are all invited to receive the above words of promise. Christmas is intended as a time of renewal. The days begin lengthening and the light once again overcomes the darkness.

As I said in my pastoral letter, serving FCC as your pastor has been one of the greatest joys of my life and ministry. Your light of love has shone into the dark places of my life. In these next few months may we all take the time and make the space we need for rest, healing and renewal. I welcome your prayers during these next months as I discern God's continued call on my life. Please know I will also hold all of you in prayer as you discern that same call for yourselves and for the congregation.

God's light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it!
