The Kaleo on the River board recently announced the hiring of a new interim camp administrator, Rev. Brad Hindsley, who will begin on May 1, 2023:

Brad has been a part of the Kaleo Community for the last six years (as a camp counselor, director and current Fundraising Committee chair) and brings, not just his passion and love for Kaleo to the table, but also offers us his spiritual guidance, his knack of offering radical hospitality, his discerning business acumen, and his cooking skills too!"



First Christian Church began a "journey into the wilderness" on December 26, 2022, when Pastor

Karen started vacation, then a three-month medical leave of absence. Our journey has been one of faith, reflection, prayer, sacrifice, and HOPE, as we discern the direction GOD is taking us. As with most journeys, FCC's has had a few bumps along the way, which might be GOD's way of letting us know that GOD is in control and will get things done as GOD has planned.

Before we begin the next phase of our journey, we need to pause and reflect on a few of the amazing things that GOD has helped us accomplish so far this year:

- Increase in average worship attendance
- Ash Wednesday Soup Supper and Service
- New members
- First-time visitors in worship
- Revitalized care ministry
- An Adult Sunday Morning class
- Increased outreach: Souper Bowl Sunday; Lenten collection barrel

The focus has been on the non-financial aspects of Stewardship, giving of our time and talents. Now the focus shifts to financial stewardship and Faith Giving.

As of February 28th, our expenses have exceeded income by just under \$13,000. Heating and administrative expenses were higher than anticipated. Pledges are running a little behind for the year and we have received less than \$500 in Faith Giving.

Again this year, the Finance Team has designated the last Sunday of each month as "Faith Giving" Sunday. Faith Giving is necessary to support and sustain the basic operation and ministries of First Christian Church every week. This year, \$3,500 in Faith Giving is needed every month to meet our approved budget obligations.

As Susan Pallas-Duncan reminded us, tax season is a great time to consider giving a portion of your tax refund to Faith Giving. Please reciprocate God's wondrous work and love by generously supporting the mission and ministry of First Christian Church.
