In the gospel of Matthew, chapter 9, we hear these words: "the harvest is plentiful but the laborers are few." This might sound familiar as I preached on this text last Sunday, June 18th. Jesus said these words to indicate to the disciples that there were people all around them who were eager for the Good News—a harvest of humans hungering for love and redemption. But the people to go out and gather in the harvest were lacking. There just weren't enough. So Jesus said "ask the Lord of the harvest to send out workers into his harvest field."

One of the many things I love about First Christian Church is all the willing hands and hearts who want to help bring in the harvest. You mow, you maintain, you cook, you visit, you care for, you sing, you greet, you welcome. You serve. And the list goes on. I feel it when I'm with you, friends: servant hearts. On Sunday, June 18, our focus was on Matthew 9:35-10:23.

In this passage we learned the importance of choosing to use our resources for the Realm of God. By making a strong pledge of time, talent, money, and other resources, we reinforce others who have already done so, and we encourage those who have not done as much to do the same. Individuals, households, and congregations become clearer and deeper in stewardship commitment when be make a deliberate "Yes".

In addition, we learned that our choices have long-term consequences. While we may not believe that failure to give to the church is going to keep us out of heaven, we know that investing money in the work of ministry and mission on behalf of others improves the quality of life in our community. It also directly benefits us with a sense of purpose, over-all well-being, and being a part of something that is larger than ourselves. It is good for us!

To accept the command of Jesus to engage in bringing wholeness to a fragmented world is to be on a mission that matters. It is a mission that is not without risk, cannot be taken without deep personal commitment, and requires that we ultimately trust God to provide what we need. Most things that matter in life are not necessarily easy or without effort.

On Sunday, July 9 our focus will be on Matthew 11:16-18, 25-30.


