


One: Called to be faithful stewards of creation we come to worship:

Sermon From The Rev. Kara Hillhouse "With You Always"

In the gospel of Matthew, the story of the Great Commission comes immediately after Jesus' resurrection. It's the very end of that particular gospel. In his Great Commission of the disciples, Jesus greets them for the first time after his resurrection and bids them go out, out, out into the world spreading the Good News to all. That's quite a tall order for this slightly-stunned, uncertain group of men and women. After all, they've just witnessed the death of their faithful friend and Lord Jesus, and now he's standing before them--alive--giving them this task. But Jesus doesn't leave them empty-handed. He adds the words we all know by heart: "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." With those few words, Jesus makes the suddenly impossible possible. The same words are a promise for us today, as we go about the tall task of loving our neighbors and spreading the Good News. We hope you'll join us for worship this Sunday, for a rejuvenating time of Music, Sacrament and the Word.



Scripture Reading

Psalm 8

To the leader: according to The Gittith. A Psalm of David.

O Lord, our Sovereign,

how majestic is your name in all the earth!

You have set your glory above the heavens.

Out of the mouths of babes and infants you have founded a bulwark because of your foes,

to silence the enemy and the avenger.

When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers,

the moon and the stars that you have established;

what are human beings that you are mindful of them,

mortals that you care for them?

Yet you have made them a little lower than God,

and crowned them with glory and honor. You have given them dominion over the works of your hands;

you have put all things under their feet, all sheep and oxen,

and also the beasts of the field,

the birds of the air, and the fish of the sea, whatever passes along the paths of the

seas.

O Lord, our Sovereign,

Finally, brothers and sisters, farewell. Put things in order, listen to my appeal, agree with one another, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you. Greet one another with a holy kiss. All the saints greet you.

The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with all of you.

On the last day of the festival, the great day, while Jesus was standing there, he cried out, 'Let anyone who is thirsty come to me, and let the one who believes in me drink. As the scripture has said, "Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water." 'Now he said this about the Spirit, which believers in him were to receive; for as yet there was no Spirit, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. When they saw him, they worshipped him; but some doubted. And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.'
