Sermon From The Rev. Kara Hillhouse "To the Cross"

The cross was a chilling and terrifying symbol of death and punishment in the time of Christ. Crosses would at times line the roads outside of Jerusalem as a visual reminder to anyone walking by that the Roman empire would crush them should they step out of line or cause any trouble. There was nothing good about a cross. And yet it is this symbol that Jesus clings to when he explains to his disciples what they will need to do in order to follow him---"take up your cross and follow me." Today, you and I find comfort and hope in the cross, because it speaks of God's deep love for us through Jesus Christ. But to the disciples "taking up their cross" was a death sentence. Really, it is no different for us today: taking up our cross IS a death sentence, as Jesus said, "For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it."

Taking up our cross means being "dead to sin and alive to God through Jesus Christ." So the cross is still a symbol of letting go of one life (the one that is separate from Christ) and taking on a different life (one that is worthy of our calling.) Join us for worship this Sunday, where we'll explore Matthew 16:21-28-- "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me." We look forward to having you join us--in person or online--for a time of music, the Word, the Lord's Supper and fellowship. We'll see you there!

Scripture Reading

Romans 12:9-21

Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honour. Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers.

Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave room for the wrath of God; for it is written, 'Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord.' No, 'if your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink; for by doing this you will heap burning coals on their heads.' Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

Matthew 16:21-28

From that time on, Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and undergo great suffering at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him, saying, 'God forbid it, Lord! This must never happen to you.' But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling-block to me; for you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things.'

Then Jesus told his disciples, 'If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it. For what will it profit them if they gain the whole world but forfeit their life? Or what will they give in return for their life?

'For the Son of Man is to come with his angels in the glory of his Father, and then he will repay everyone for what has been done. Truly I tell you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the Son of Man coming in his kingdom.'
