

Sermon

From The Rev. Kara Hillhouse "Start Again"

Have you ever watched the movie *The Ten Commandments*, starring Charlton Heston and Yul Brynner? I remember watching it a handful of times as a kid, when it would play on television, which it seemed was a fairly regular occurrence. The scene where God's Angel of Death makes its silent way through the homes of the Israelites and Egptians, killing the first-born male in each home not marked by blood, is terrifying to me. This was the movie's depiction of how God rescued the Israelites from Egyptian slavery, which is remembered every year during the Jewish holy days of Passover. God saved the Israelites from slavery by sending the ten plagues, the first nine of which didn't move Pharaoh's heart to release the Israelites, but the tenth one (killing the first-born males) which did. Fast forward between 1300-1600 years later (depending on your source) and Jesus of Nazareth was gathering with his friends in an upper room for a Jewish Passover meal. It was just another Passover meal, but this time something amazing happened, something that has changed our lives 2000 years later. Join us for worship this Sunday where we'll explore Exodus 12:1-14 and be rejuvenated by a time of music, fellowship and communion. We'll see you Sunday!

Exodus 12:1-14

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt: This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you. Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth of this month they are to take a lamb for each family, a lamb for each household. If a household is too small for a whole lamb, it shall join its closest neighbor in obtaining one; the lamb shall be divided in proportion to the number of people who eat of it. Your lamb shall be without blemish, a yearold male; you may take it from the sheep or from the goats. You shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month; then the whole assembled congregation of Israel shall slaughter it at twilight. They shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it. They shall eat the lamb that same night; they shall eat it roasted over the fire with unleavened bread and bitter herbs. Do not eat any of it raw or boiled in water, but roasted over the fire, with its head, legs, and inner organs. You shall let none of it remain until the morning; anything that remains until the morning you shall burn. This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly. It is the passover of the Lord. For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, both human beings and animals; on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgements: I am the Lord. The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt.

This day shall be a day of remembrance for you. You shall celebrate it as a festival to the Lord; throughout your generations you shall observe it as a perpetual ordinance.
