

One: We are summoned to let the Spirit be planted within us.


Many: We will deepen our souls so we might grow in love.

Sermon

From The Rev. Kara Hillhouse

"Let My Lifesong Sing to You."

Prince Rainey Rivers writes, "Liking God is not enough. Jesus' message to the Pharisees is clear. God is not interested in superficial relationships. God wants total devotion, a complete surrender of one's mind, will, and desires. ... Loving God involves action and ethics.... Loving God is not sentimental. Loving God is compassionate action toward neighbors and strangers." In our scripture this week we find Jesus once more being challenged by the religious leaders in an attempt to trick him into saying something...anything...that they could use to crush him. This time it's this question: "teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" And Jesus' answer is the well-worn, well-loved, too-often-neglected "'you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second one is like it, 'you shall love your neighbor as yourself." There were hundreds and hundreds of laws observant Jews had to follow in Jesus' time, but what Jesus is telling the people around him is this: if you can get these two commandments right, all the others will be covered. If you can love the Lord, and if you can love your neighbor, then you will end up fulfilling all the other laws as well. Join us for worship on Sunday where we'll explore this text, be blessed with beautiful music and celebrate the Lord's Supper. We'll also be bringing our Commitment Pledges to be blessed this week during worship. We'll see you Sunday!

Psalm 90:1 - 6, 13 - 17

Matthew 22:34 - 40

Lord, you have been our dwelling place in all generations. Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever you had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God.

You turn us back to dust, and say, "Turn back, you mortals." For a thousand years in your sight are like yesterday when it is past, or like a watch in the night.

O prosper the work of our hands!

When the Pharisees heard that he had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, and one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" He said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."
