Sermon From The Rev. Kara Hillhouse Just Wait

In an ideal faith community, spiritual gifts are shared. They are diverse and yet unified. They are not yet perfect or complete but are nonetheless powerful and intended to grow in strength day by day. In Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, Paul is speaking to a church that struggles to grow into its full potential because it is so busy fighting over who has what gifts and what knowledge. Paul understands that these early Christians suffer under the misbelief that there are not enough spiritual gifts to go around. He is striving to help them know that they have been given everything they need from God, and that they need to patiently wait because God is not done working in their lives. In this Advent season, we wait to experience not only the coming of the Christ child, but also the fullness of God's kingdom. Join us for worship this week where we'll explore the first part of Paul's letter to the people of Corinth, and be rejuvenated by fellowship, beautiful music and the Lord's Supper.
