Sermon

From The Rev. Kara Hillhouse *An Invitation to a Blessing*

What impossible situation - one with NO HOPE AT ALL - have you found yourself in, where God is using you "for the good of His kingdom" and you are struggling with whether to say "no way" and run away, or to say "okay Lord, let it be according to your will"?? In our text this week, we find young Mary being visited by the angel Gabriel, and hearing the news that SHE will bear the son of God. At first she was like, "no way Lord, how can this be?" But by the end of her interaction with Gabriel, she said, "let it be according to thy will." Still, she was in a pickle. Unmarried. Pregnant. In her time and culture?! This would have been an impossible situation, one with no hope at all. And yet God, in God's infinite power and glory, uses this impossible situation to bless and help this hopeless world. So when we get into impossible situations...whatever that might look like to you...remember that God is the master of possibilities. God takes what looks to be a hopeless dead end and brings new life to it. Join us Sunday morning for the fourth Sunday of Advent worship--a time of fellowship, music, the Word and communion. Scripture Readings

Luke 1:46b-55 Luke 1:26-38

And Mary said, "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name. His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts. He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly; he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty. He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants forever."



In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son, and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. For nothing will be impossible with God." Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.
