# **Pastor's Corner**

Dear Friends,

The past two weeks during our sermons we've been looking at "call" stories, first with the young boy Samuel and then with the four fishermen, called by Jesus to follow him. We've seen examples of people faithfully heeding God's call to join Him on His mission to heal and love the world. And we've talked about how hard following this call can be. There are days when we have exuberant energy... and days when we feel weary and heavy-laden. Lent, which begins on Wednesday, February 14th, with Ash Wednesday, can also be a time that feels heavy-laden: it is solemn, it can feel a little dark. A few years ago I came across the following poem and it resonated with me. I'd like to share it with you, and maybe it will speak to you, too.

i have come undone,
no longer content
with what was enough
to get by,
to carry me
through another day.
do you feel it too,
mercy tugging in the darkness?
oh I'm coming,
dragging my bones
to that path of completeness,
for that ageless saturation of
love.

I love the phrase "mercy tugging in the darkness." The image, of a great benevolent force that we cannot see or describe pulling us in a direction that will benefit us, is a powerful thing to me. Is that how God works in our lives? Gently nudging us in the direction He'd have us go for our own good; and, when necessary, pushing or pulling us a little harder, when we get stubborn and refuse to listen to His voice. *Mercy tugging in the darkness*. You see, God invites us into the fullness of His grace and mercy, but never demands it. He invites us into fellowship with Him. It's a choice.

If we choose to follow, grace and mercy are what we will find. When we have "come undone" and have reached our wits' end, we will find a "saturation of love" waiting for us. Doesn't that sound wonderful? Isn't that exactly what we need? Not just now, but every single day of our lives? I know I do. I hope you'll choose to follow God's nudges in your own life. It will make all the difference - not that we won't still have moments of coming undone, because we will. But we will have mercy and love as our companions along the way.

Dear First Christian Church,

We would like to thank you for your generous gifts to our family as we have searched for Tyler. The gift cards helped all of us, and we appreciate your kindness.

We ask for your continued prayers as we continue through this journey. There is still no lead as to Tyler's whereabouts, and that has been very frustrating.

Our family will continue to praise God for so many good people, such as yourselves, who have supported us these past 2 months.

Our YouTube video ministry has increased significantly since July 23rd of last year. This is when we started posting individual selections from our Sunday services. On December 31, 2022 we had 9 subscribers of our YouTube channel and we had 5,876 views of our videos in 2022. All the viewers were from the United States. Compare this to 2023 where we had 19,151 views of our videos and 139 subscribers of our YouTube channel. Only 1,334 views last year came from our subscribers whereas 17,817 views came from non-subscribers. Today we have viewers from around the world. We have viewers in the United Kingdom, Sweden, Canada, South Africa, Australia, India, Germany, Malaysia, Mexico, Ireland, Norway, Suriname, Poland, Nigeria, Netherlands, and of course the United States. Our viewership is predominately men and women over the age of 45. As of 01-16-2024, we have 145 subscribers, 18 of those being in the last 28 days. We have six videos with over 600 views. Our top video is Glorious Things of Thee Are Spoken posted in September with 852 views. We also have Playlists for the Weekly Hymns, The Sanctuary Choir, Handbells, The Recorder Consort, The Torch Worship Team, Mark's service music, the 2023 Lessons and Carols and 2023 Christmas Eve Service.

We also have seen growth in the reach of our Facebook and Instagram accounts since the beginning of 2023. We now have 292 followers of our Facebook page and 107 followers of our Instagram page. We have followers from the United States, Czech Republic, Kenya, Bangladesh, Brazil, Congo, Luxembourg, Malaysia and Nigeria.

I hope you will take the time to check out our YouTube videos if you don't already. I would encourage you to Subscribe to our channel and click the Like button on our videos. Also, if there is a video you really enjoy, share it with your friends. The number of subscribers and likes play a role in the algorithm that suggests our videos to viewers.

If you have a Facebook or Instagram page, I would encourage you to Follow First Christian Church and to like our posts. If you don't have a Facebook or Instagram page, it is free to sign up. You don't have to follow your friends or other pages, just follow First Christian Church so you don't miss out. The posts with pictures showing the life and activities of our church consistently have the best reach of our posts. If you are involved in a church activity, take some pictures and send them to me, so I can post them. If there is a post you really like, again share it with your Facebook or Instagram friends and introduce them to what we have to share about First Christian Church.

I am amazed at how far the ministry of First Christian Church has spread around the world these past few months. We can grow it even bigger with your help!

The Finance Team cannot say THANK YOU enough to everyone who participated in 2023 Faith Giving, which topped out at just over \$25,000! Almost one third of this total (just over \$8,000) was raised in December. What a show of loyalty and faithfulness to the church!

In addition, over 99% of all 2023 pledges were received! Because of this, 2023 is the fifth year in a row First Christian Church has ended the year in the black with enough income to cover expenses. - ⇒ Take dirty towels and dishcloths home to launder and return


