From The Rev. Kara Hillhouse *Metamorphosis*


In an interesting repeat of a verse we heard at the beginning of Jesus' ministry, when he was baptized, this week we once more hear the words "this is my Son, the Beloved" coming out of the heavens. That's about the only similarity between these two stories, as this time the words are coming out of the heavens while Jesus is standing on a mountaintop with Elijah and Moses. They're having a little chitchat, about who knows what, and three disciples are there to witness this moment. It's an odd occurrence in and of itself, but what is just as perplexing is that Jesus's clothes begin to shine dazzlingly white--"such as no one on earth could bleach them" (Mark 9:3). And then, in what is fast becoming one of Jesus' favorite phrases, he tells the disciples to "tell no one what they had seen" (Mark 9:9). Jesus' Transfiguration is an interesting story of a slightly confusing event, but there are some lessons we can learn from it. Join us for worship this Sunday where we'll hear this story interpreted, be fed at the Lord's Table and rejuvenated by a time of fellowship and music. We'll see you Sunday!

Mark 9:2-10

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain apart, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no one on earth could bleach them. And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, who were talking with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He did not know what to say, for they were terrified. Then a cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud there came a voice. "This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!" Suddenly when they looked around, they saw no one with them any more, but only Jesus.

As they were coming down the mountain, he ordered them to tell no one about what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. So they kept the matter to themselves, questioning what this rising from the dead could mean.
