HVAC System Update

EXCITING news! We are making progress on our HVAC system upgrade! The Sanctuary Phase of this project began the week of April 8th and should be completed by mid-May (weather permitting). There will be **NO air conditioning or heat** in the sanctuary until the new system is operational. However, we do not anticipate that this will cause any concerns for our worship services, given current forecasts.

To date, the ice tank condenser and old concrete (located on the SE side of the building), has been removed and the new concrete has been poured. In the coming weeks, the old equipment will be removed and new equipment will be installed.

As of this writing, we have received a little more than *half of our goal* in donations to pay for our new HVAC system upgrade. We thank each one of you for prayerfully considering how you might be able to give to help cover the remaining amount. Any size donation will help us work towards our goal. If you come to this beautiful church, sit in it, worship in it - if your life has been impacted by this church in any way - please consider giving. We thank you for your generosity.

Pastor's Corner

Dear friends,

Three weeks ago we celebrated Easter. Resurrection day. It was joyful, and festive, and lighthearted. It was a blessed release after the somber days preceding it. We proclaimed that Christ was risen, He was risen indeed! But now we've returned to our everyday lives. They aren't always very joyful; they aren't always very festive or lighthearted. They're filled, at times, with worries, challenges, heartache and fears. So now what do we do?? How do we live our lives in light of the Resurrection? That's the million dollar question.

If Jesus really died for our sakes, for yours and for mine - if Jesus really overcame death and rose from the grave in order to give us the abundant and eternal life - then we can see all the challenges and pain in a new light. And in the meantime, He helps us to have hope because of Christ. I pray that as Easter recedes into the background, the power of its promise would continue to live in your hearts; so that, day by day, you would know that God is not finished with you yet. He is risen! He is risen indeed! Thanks be to God!

First Christian Church Foundation News

The FCC Foundation meets four times a year to oversee the assets, which are invested with Morgan Stanley, and process requests for church projects. In 2023, the Foundation contributed \$24,700.00 to the church budget from its Unencumbered Fund.

In addition, income from the Hofmann Fund supported the replacement of the handicap lift at the alley entrance and is helping to fund the new HVAC system for the sanctuary, chapel and parlor.

The Foundation gratefully accepted two bequests – from the Harold Baker and from the Arlene Heimer estates – in 2023, along with memorials honoring the lives of Lois Frogge and Mildred Brockemeyer.

Total assets of the Foundation on December 31, 2023 were \$1,057,093.53. For a comprehensive year-end report submitted to the FCC Official Board at its March meeting, contact the church office.
