New HVAC System Update

VERY EXCITING NEWS! The new sanctuary air conditioning unit is operational, and worship in the sanctuary was very comfortable, this past Sunday. Although there's still some fine-tuning that needs to be completed, we're already experiencing many of the benefits. One unanticipated benefit is how quiet the new system is. Many in attendance shared they were able to hear much better.

As of June 23, 2024, we have received just over \$42,000, which is over 80% of our goal, in donations to pay for our new HVAC system upgrade. We still need to raise \$8,000. Your donation towards this needed upgrade will ensure that this beautiful and sacred space will continue to be a place of hope, community, and connection with God for generations to come.

We ask you to prayerfully consider how you can give to help cover the remaining amount. It will take all of us to make this happen. Any size donation will help us work towards our goal. June 9 was the **kickoff** of our "*Measuring What Matters*" stewardship campaign. On Sunday, June 9, our kickoff was based on Joshua 24:14-24.

In this passage we learned that Joshua, after leading the Israelites to the Promised Land, is nearing the end of his life. Joshua begins to prepare the people for life without him by reminding them of everything that God has provided them and encouraging them to remain faithful to God. Over the years, the Israelites' allegiance to God had wavered as many other, very tempting, "deities" were encountered. Then Joshua issues this command: "choose this day who you will serve... but as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord."

Who are you going to serve? We only have two options. Will you serve God? Or will you not? God wants a relationship with us, which will impact every aspect of our lives. The choice to serve God is not easy, it must be intentional and needs to be addressed every day. Choosing to serve God means caring for others before ourselves.

On Sunday, July 14 our Gospel scripture and sermon will focus on Mark 4:26-32.
