Sermon From The Rev. Kara Hillhouse Rewire!

There is a lot about Jesus' life and Jesus' words that we cannot understand unless we understand the context in which he lived. Jesus was a Jew: he grew up Jewish, he learned as a Jew, he worshipped as a Jew, he knew the Hebrew Bible (we're going to talk this Sunday about what that is) inside and out--in fact he quotes it frequently during his ministry. So...it's pretty important that we, too, try to understand the Old Testament. Many of Jesus' followers (the ones who were also Jewish), would have been familiar with the hundreds of laws prescribed in the books of the Torah (where the Laws of Moses are found), and one day someone asks Jesus, 'Teacher, which law is the most important?" And Jesus, who would have grown up following those hundreds of laws, tells those around him, "Hey! There's really only two that matter: love the Lord your God with all your heart, and love your neighbor as yourself." And there it was: the two most important things to know about following Jesus. If we can master these two commandments, all the other important things will fall into place. But following Jesus' words requires a total rewiring of our brains, as we are molded and surrounded by a very different vision cast by the world in which we live. Join us for worship Sunday as we explore the greatest commandments and how they impact our lives today. Come and be filled by a time of meaningful worship, beautiful music and being refueled at the Lord's Table. We'll see you Sunday!

IMPORTANT NEWS REGARDING PARKING LOT USAGE:

As of now, we are <u>no longer using the Masonic Temple parking lot at anytime, in-</u> <u>cluding Sunday mornings</u>. We have been informed by the Temple that they will tow any cars parked in the wrong spots. Please, when you come to church for worship or other activities throughout the week, park in First Christian's parking lot only (or street parking). The church parking lot is located at the corner of 17th and K Streets. Only the paved spots are the church's. Do not park in the gravel spots next to the Masonic Temple building.

Here are some other important things to keep in mind: **on weekdays**, between the hours of 6am-5pm (the times on the parking lot sign are incorrect), most of our lot is reserved parking, and we cannot park in those spaces. There are, however, five spaces reserved for First Christian Church--two marked Staff Parking, and three additional ones with signs indicating they are for First Christian. These three signs are in the northeast corner of the rows closest to 17th Street, not next to the Staff Parking spaces. Please park in these three spaces. After 5pm on weekdays you are free to park in any spot in our lot. **On Saturdays and Sundays** you can park anywhere in our lot. On home football game days, you are welcome to park in the lot *if there is room*. The lot is used for football game tailgating and may be full.

Again, *please do not park in the Masonic Temple parking lot at any time*. I understand this is a lot of information. However, we do not want any of you to have your cars towed, and we need to respect the spaces in our lot that are reserved for others.
