## Sermon

#### From The Rev. Kara Hillhouse

#### The Pause

In the Bible we see God actively engaging with his people time after time: through angels and human messengers and burning bushes and pillars of smoke and gusting wind and parting seas and floods and even silence...so many different ways God interacted with humanity. In Advent alone, we see God working through ordinary people in the stories of John the Baptist, Mary and Joseph, Elizabeth, the three kings, and the shepherds. Does God continue to actively engage with us today? And, if so, is it as dramatic as it was in Biblical times, because the Biblical stories are excellent fodder for dramatic Hollywood movies. More importantly, do we look for God acting in the world, and, if we see God acting in our lives, do we say "yes, Lord"? All of the characters above said "yes" to God -- most without hesitation. Do we hesitate when we're asked to "go"? Is our response, "Hey, God, I'd really like to say yes to your invitation to follow you, but I've got a pretty full calendar and this week just doesn't work for me. How about next week? I can fit you in Wednesday between noon and 2pm." What can we learn from the Advent stories? Join us for worship this week, when we'll light another Advent candle, listen for God's continued nudge in our lives, and share in the feast at Christ's table. We'll see you at First!

# Scripture Readings

## Malachi 3:1-4

See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight indeed, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the Lord in righteousness. Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in the days of old and as in former years.



Luke 1:26-38

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. For nothing will be impossible with God." Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.
