Dear Friends,

One of the many blessings God has given us is the ability to think, reason, feel and express ourselves. On the other hand, one of the greatest *challenges* God has given us is the ability to think, reason, feel and express ourselves. It is both a blessing and a challenge. We see it manifest itself in both ways in the world around us: the joys *and* the challenges of our diverse personalities, opinions and views on how things should be. What do we do when we reach a crossroads and cannot agree with someone on something which is vitally important to us, and around which we hold a lot of passion? We see this clashing of views all around us: in politics, in relationships, and even within the global and denominational church. So, what do we do when we cannot see eye-to-eye?

We turn to the Cross. The Cross is the uniting factor in our lives. Jesus talked, interacted with and ate with sinners (that's us), and loved them and brought them into the fold so that they might have the abundant life He alone offered. He didn't die for the righteous, because none of us are righteous, on our own. But because He died for the unrighteous we have been made righteous, through Him. This is not our own doing, but is the work of the Lord, and *"it is marvelous in our eyes"* (Psalm 118:23).

Because of the Cross, we have all have been made worthy, despite our differences and the challenges of that diversity. This is the uniting power of the Cross. This is the only truth we can hold onto when all else seems topsy-turvy in the world. If we can look at our siblings with whom we disagree and say "God died for you as well as for me" then perhaps we can learn to love one another in the midst of the struggle. Knowing that God loves our enemies just like He loves us is a humbling thing; and that's good, because humility is essential to getting past the challenges of differences.

Look to the Cross. Fall before the Cross. Marvel at the Cross and all that it means for our lives. Thanks be to God for being *with us*, and for *putting up with us*, as we work to find the way towards Unity. Have a great week!! Peace be with you all.

2024 Local Outreach Recipients

Back -Door Blessings Ministry Update

Since beginning this Ministry in September of 2024 we have provided 9 different recipients with food pantry items and gift cards (SCRIP) for fuel, groceries and fast food.

While assisting a lady living in our prayer garden for a month we learned about the Street Outreach Program -the combined effort of Lincoln Police Department & CenterPointe. FCC has contacted Street Outreach for assistance on 6 separate occasions. All 6 in need have come to the church before or following Worship. Street Outreach meets with us and the person (s) to assess what their needs are and how they can help. To date Street Outreach has provided Greyhound bus tickets to get stranded people back to their homes in North Platte, NE and Fargo, ND. Street Outreach comes prepared to give a ride to the bus station, People's City Mission or Matt Talbot Kitchen. Street Outreach provides weather appropriate clothing, boots, tents, warm blankets, bags of personal hygiene items, water and no - prep snacks. The Back -Door Blessings Ministry team of Pastor Kara Hillhouse, Jim Blosser, Wayne Duncan and Elaine Parman have all witnessed the respect and dignity the Street Outreach Team follows as they interact with those in need.

In December and part of January our collection barrel was filled with the most needed items Street Outreach needs to fulfill their mission. In addition to the items we collected, a \$100 monetary donation was delivered to CenterPointe.

At this time our *Back-Door Blessings* ministry does not need cupboard items. Monetary donations to purchase gift cards are always appreciated. Please put BDB on memo line.
