

## Sermon

#### From The Rev. Kara Hillhouse

Luke 19:28-44 How Far Will You Go?

Palm Sunday is a bit of an anomaly sticking out in the season of Lent. It's so celebratory: Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, with the people draping things on the ground before him (palm branches, other kinds of branches or clothing, depending on which gospel we read from) and shouting words of praise. It's as if there was not a care in the world...just Jesus finally getting the recognition he deserved. How odd it is—an oasis of positivity and hope in the midst of a season of repentance. In Luke's version of this story, however, it ends with Jesus lamenting over Jerusalem. Again—it's the second time he's done it. He knows—even if no one else gets it—what is about to happen. The people will embrace him today...and yet hand him over to the authorities for crucifixion by the end of the week. And so, we don't stop observing Holy Week between Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. If we do, we miss out on the most important part of the story: Jesus' sacrifice that we observe on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Join us for worship Sunday as we begin to walk with Jesus through his final days in Jerusalem—the holiest of weeks in the church year. We'll see you at First!

#### First Christian Church 24 - Hour Prayer Vigil



# Scripture Readings

## Psalm 118:19-23

Open to me the gates of the righteousness, that I may enter through them and give thanks to the Lord. This is the gate of the Lord; the righteous shall enter through it. I thank you that you answered me and have become my salvation. The stone that the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone. This is the Lord's doing; it is marvelous in our eyes.



## Luke 19:28-44

After he had said this, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. When he had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, saying, "Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it." So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?" They said, "The Lord needs it." Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, saying, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!" Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, order your disciples to stop." He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out." As he came near and saw the city, he wept over it, saying, "If you, even you, had only recognized on this day the things that make for peace! But now they are hidden from your eyes. Indeed, the days will come upon you, when your enemies will set up ramparts around you and surround you, and hem you in on every side. They will crush you to the ground, you and your children within you, and they will not leave within you one stone upon another; because you did not recognize the time of your visitation from God."
