# Sermon

## From The Rev. Kara Hillhouse

Luke 24: 1-12

The Risky Choice: Believe!

Faith is, at its core, a risk. It's choosing to trust in something and someone we cannot physically sit down and talk with (although I would challenge what I just said by reminding myself that we *do* have access to "one-on-one" conversations with God through prayer, and can encounter God in other ways as well....i.e. Paul on that road to Damascus). But I can't really buy God a cup of coffee for a chat. It's a little counterintuitive to place our trust in something we can't understand fully-we like details, hard facts, certainties. And, although we do get some of those when we place our faith in Jesus Christ, there's a certain amount of divine mystery involved. And we just have to be okay with that. So...it's a risk. And yet, despite the risk and the uncertainty (and maybe even doubts), we gather this week to praise God for the great gift of Jesus Christ, who loved us so much he *gave* his life so that you and I might *have* Life! Easter is truly a time of joy. We ARE an Easter people...that is the very foundation of our identity. Let us remember that our lives have been changed by this great gift by joining together to praise God! I hope you'll join us for this special celebration. We'll see you at First!

I shall not die, but I shall live, and recount the deeds of the LORD.



## Luke 24:1 - 12

But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in, they did not find the body. While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again." Then they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened.
