### **Sermon** From The Rev. Kara Hillhouse John 20:19-31 Set Free

For ten years Chapman University has done an annual Chapman Survey of American Fears. The survey focuses on what Americans fear, the possible causes of those fears and how the fears affect the individuals' lives. The survey asks participants about 85 fears from categories ranging from fears about the government and the election, to the fear of crime, the environment, the economy, personal finances, AI technology, sickness and health, natural and man-made disasters, terrorism, war, ghosts, and others. The results? Between one-half and two-thirds of Americans live with fear on a daily basis. So...I believe the scripture for this Sunday is relevant to us, especially today. In it, we find Jesus appearing to his disciples after his Resurrection. The disciples had all heard about what had happened to Jesus, and Jesus had appeared to some of the disciples already, but some of them had not encountered the Resurrected Savior in person yet. The disciples are afraid. They're hiding behind locked doors. I would imagine they're afraid of so much that they cannot understand, and yet at the same time cautiously hopeful, because, if all that they've heard is true, somewhere Jesus is alive. I think we're all afraid and hiding behind something; and I think we're all cautiously hopeful, because we, too, have heard the Good News of the Resurrected Christ. What God longs to do is set us free from these fears that hold us hostage. Join us for worship this Sunday, for a time of fellowship, worship and listening for God's gentle nudging as we continue to seek the Resurrected Christ. We'll see you at First!

John 20:19-31

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with

with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails, and my hand in his side, I will not believe." A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.
