



Sermon From The Rev. Kara Hillhouse John 13:31-35 Define This

We're going back in time a bit in our gospel reading this week -back to the night of Jesus' arrest. Jesus was talking with his disciples, right after Judas left to betray Jesus and to share his whereabouts with the authorities who had been itching to arrest him. Ironically, the topic on which Jesus is speaking is love. Jesus watched Judas as he left the Upper Room to betray him, and then talked with his disciples about love? Not just any love -the same love he'd preached about for several years: the one that was so transformative it was about to get him killed. Maybe we should call it a dangerous love, because it certainly seems risky to love at times. But we need to hear about this radical love -this New Commandment -because without it people will not know we follow Jesus. "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another" (John 13:34). As Rev. David Lose puts it, these challenging words from Jesus "need to be preached again and again because when they are spoken, heard, and lived, we find ourselves in that foreign land and strange country of mercy and grace we call the kingdom of God." Join us for worship Sunday, for a time of being still and listening for God's still-living Words. Come be re-fueled by a time of worship, fellowship and feasting at the Lord's Table. We'll see you at First!
