

Sermon

Revelation 21:10, 22:1-5

Is this THE END?

For some people this question is answered with a confident and expectant "YES! Hallelujah!" But there are folks who have enough experience of the Bible or church or church people to know that one day there will be an end, and for some that end will not be pleasant. COVID-19, the war in Israel, political issues and devastating weather events are sited as signs the end is nigh.

When Jesus said, "I'll be back" and "I've gone to prepare a place for you" his followers had MORE questions. His admonishment against fear often goes out the window when we want answers about what happens at our individual or collective end. John's description of judgement in Revelation leaves many wondering whether they need eternal fire insurance. There are many best-selling books that claim to have decoded this book. Readers seek reassurance of being on the right side to ease the discomfort of uncertainty. But how much of life is certain?

This is Mental Health Awareness Month. Faith communities are uniquely poised to provide places where people can experience acceptance, nurture and hope. This presence is needed now more than ever as people report increased anxiety over world events, individual and family safety, personal finances and climate change.* How can we be a presence of peace in an anxious world without dismissing the complexity of today's issues? How do thoughtful people of faith answer questions about "THE END"?

Scripture Readings


Revelation 21:10, 22:1-5

I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid. You heard me say to you, 'I am going away, and I am coming to you.' If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father, because the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you this before it occurs, so that when it does occur you may believe.
