Sermon From The Rev. Kara Hillhouse Deuteronomy 26:1-11 Priorities

This Sunday we begin our Stewardship Campaign. We intentionally have an extended campaign (as we did last year), because we know Stewardship isn't a once-a-year commitment. Rather, Stewardship is a *way of life*. And, as usually happens, developing long-term habits takes lots of help: education, inspiration, and encouragement. So, we make it a season here at First Christian. We kick off our campaign this week with a text from Deuteronomy that discusses God's command that the Israelites make a sacrifice to him with the first fruits of their labor, as a sign of their gratitude for God's faithfulness to them. From the abundance of their harvest, God was to come first. What can we learn from this? Join us for worship this Sunday, where we'll study the Word and learn more about what it means to be a good and generous steward towards God. Come be fed and renewed in God's presence. Scripture Readings Psalm 82 Deutero

God has taken his place in the divine council; in the midst of the gods he holds judgment: "How long will you judge unjustly and show partiality to the wicked? Give justice to the weak and the orphan; maintain the right of the lowly and the destitute. Rescue the weak and the needy; deliver them from the hand of the wicked." They have neither knowledge nor understanding; they walk around in darkness; all the foundations of the earth are shaken. I say, "You are gods, children of the Most High, all of you; nevertheless, you shall die like mortals and fall like any prince." Rise up, O God, judge the earth, for all the nations belong to you!



Deuteronomy 26:1-11

"When you have come into the land that the Lord your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess and you possess it and settle in it, you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the Lord your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the Lord your God will choose as a dwelling for his name. You shall go to the priest who is in office at that time and say to him, 'Today I declare to the Lord your God that I have come into the land that the Lord swore to our ancestors to give us.' When the priest takes the basket from your hand and sets it down before the altar of the Lord your God, you shall make this response before the Lord your God: 'A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down into Egypt and lived there as an alien, few in number, and there he became a great nation, mighty and populous. When the Egyptians treated us harshly and afflicted us, by imposing hard labor on us, we cried to the Lord, the God of our ancestors; the Lord heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. The Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with a terrifying display of power, and with signs and wonders; and he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. So now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that you, O Lord, have given me.' You shall set it down before the Lord your God and bow down before the Lord your God. Then you, together with the Levites and the aliens who reside among you, shall celebrate with all the bounty that the Lord your God has given to you and to your house.
