It originated in 1933 at a Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA and in 1940 it was endorsed by the Federal Council of Churches to promote it worldwide. The Rev. Donald Craig Kerr, son of the originator, shares "The concept spread slowly at first. It was during the Second World War that the spirit caught hold, because we were trying to hold the world together. It emphasized that we are one in the Spirit and the Gospel of lesus Christ".

Pastor's Corner Dear Friends,

"You would know the secret of death. But how shall you find it unless you seek it in the heart of life? If you would indeed behold the spirit of death, open your heart wide unto the body of life. For life and death are one, even as the river and the sea are

Kahlil Gibran, The Prophet

In John 1:1-2 we read, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God." "The Word" referenced here is Jesus Christ. When I first read this verse, I was like what???! What do you mean Jesus was around in the beginning? In the Bible he doesn't take the stage until the second act (New Testament)—when the world was being created Jesus should have still been in hair and makeup. But there it is, Jesus, present from the get-go: laying the foundation, directing the workings of the world and the vast places beyond it. I imagine him wearing one of those yellow hard hats, with blueprints in his hand, talking with a worker and pointing off into the distance where some really important construction project was taking place; making sure everything was done right.

This brought to mind Kahlil Gibran's quote above, about Life and death. Because of God's grace, Life is always on the scene; a force holding all things together; a power that has the final say, because of Jesus' Resurrection over death. But there'd be no need for Life without death. Rather than being adversaries, though, they flow into each other as naturally as an inhale and exhale, and we have to embrace both, or we'll miss out on Life's power. Though death seems to prevail, Life is there, maybe even wearing a hard hat and holding the blueprints, so that all unfolds as it should. "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?".... [T]hanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Corinthians 15:55-57).

As I went through my sister's closet recently, and packed up her clothes, preparing to take them to Goodwill, I reflected on how sad it is that all remnants of 56 years of living can be wiped away in the 17 hours it took to empty her apartment. As if she'd never been there. And it is true that if we only look with eyes that see the tangible, she is gone. But for we who look with different eyes, who can see the empty tomb instead of the cross, her life is ever-present. Paul wrote, "if we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord. So then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's" (Romans 14:8). Sorrow will never have the final word—that belongs to Christ alone, and he promises the Resurrection Life. Thanks be to God! Amen.

2026 Stewardship Campaign Mission Project



for September & October

The 2026 Stewardship Campaign Mission Project recipient is "I've Got A Name", a non-profit that strives to put an end to sex trafficking in Nebraska by generating awareness of the problem and taking action against it.

The "I've Got A Name" three pillars are:

- Awareness Help the public identify sex trafficking and become engaged to fight against it through events and public speaking opportunities
- **Street Outreach** Take action through Street Outreach, where we help restore the lives of women and girls who are vulnerable and victims of sex trafficking.
- Men Against Demand Educate men on their critical role in the fight against sex trafficking and empower them to be leaders of respect for all women and children.

"People think that sex trafficking only happens overseas, in the big cities or on the east coast and west coast... but it's real, right here in Nebraska." ~ Paul Yates, Executive Director

The reality of where we live: 900 individuals sold for sex in Nebraska every month, 200 in Lincoln alone; most victims know their traffickers (romantic partners or family members); the average age of a child who enters the commercial sex trade is 13 years old; 1 out of 250 Nebraska high school and middle school students enter the sex trade each year.

In 2022 "I've Got A Name" Street Outreach served 16 clients per month and 51 personal visits per month. From January through April of 2025 they have served 31 clients per month and 112 personal visits per month.

Please join in this stand against sex trafficking because "I've Got A Name" believes "When we stand together and refuse to let them fight alone, that's when real change happens". The funds we collect will be directed to the immediate needs of the client, not operating budgets.

Our Back Door Blessings
Ministry continues to be a
much needed ministry
seven days a week. In the
year it has been in existence we have provided
food items, bottled water,
personal hygiene supplies,
gift cards to local fast food
locations, gift cards to
Russ's and Walmart as
well as U-Stop fuel vouchers. We encourage them to
use the MyLink, a free app



that links them to the many non-profit resources in the community for meals,

showers, laundry facilities, free 30-day bus passes, diapers, free vet care and even free animal food.

We have worked with the Lincoln Police Department/ CenterPointe Street Outreach team on several occasions. They have provided tremendous support to those we cannot assist with Greyhound bus passes back home, a backpack of most needed items to survive on the streets in all types of weather and rides to People City Mission. The items we collected in our August Collection Barrel will be used to stuff the backpacks. A win-win for all!

At this time the pantry is stocked with food items, personal hygiene items, blankets, hand warmers, hats, gloves and other necessities. If you want to make a financial donation we can always use more gift cards and fuel vouchers that are purchased through the SCRIP program. Please put BDB on your memo line.

Today represents one of our major annual activities. Providing hotdogs, chips, and cookies for Praise Fest only happens without the support of the people in our church and associated with our church. Our budget also pays for half the cost of treats purchased for Praise Fest.

We help coordinate Thanksgiving dinner by providing turkey, mashed potatoes and gravy. Thanksgiving dinner and soup dinners (Ash Wednesday and Maundy Thursday) for the congregation with the help of many donations of food and time.

Hospitality also includes making sure that kitchen is fully stocked with coffee and other supplies so that we can all enjoy our Sunday Coffee Fellowship which is supported and enjoyed by many.

Other forms of hospitality are organized by the Disciple's women's group for funerals and a men's group supplying Easter morning breakfast.

When I first entered the kitchen and asked how I can help, you were there to get me started. There was always someone there to explain what we needed to do and to give me helpful tips. Listen. Since the earliest of days, when Genesis tells us that the newly created humanity heard the Lord God in the garden of Eden, the sense of hearing, listening, communicating has been an important way to feel the divine presence. It's so important that listening becomes a repeated refrain, with the Hebrew word "shema" often found in Hebrew scriptures. It can mean listen. It can mean obey. It always means pay attention and use that sense of hearing to listen and feel (in a way of knowing) the presence of the divine among us.

Justice in Action is an interfaith, grassroots coalition of faith communities in Lancaster County, working to harness the power of organized people to address big community problems. As a member of Justice in Action, FCC works within the coalition to identify problems, research responses and implement solutions.

On Thursday, October 9, FCC will host a <u>listening session</u> at the church at 6:00 p.m. You are invited to participate by sharing the community problem/problems that have impacted you, your family, your neighbors personally. Based on the listening sessions held throughout the community in October, Justice in Action is expected to select a new community problem to begin working on just as it has addressed pretrial diversion, a mental health navigation system, and pre-eviction mediation.
