Lamentations 3:19-26 *Hope in Troubled Times* 

The book of Lamentations is, not surprisingly, a series of laments (poems, actually) over the destruction of Jerusalem and the Temple in 586 BCE. It's obvious as we read the book how deep was the author's pain and grief over this event, and all it led to. Yet, in the midst of the sorrow were glimpses of hope. And, as always happens when I see this mixture of pain and resilience, I am sometimes at a loss to explain what it is within us that allows us to stand at the outskirts of the desolation of our lives, and see hope on the horizon. There is something within us, as people of faith, that knows, innately, that though man may sorrow, God endures. And because God endures, the great purpose and workings of God endure. Join us for worship as we ponder this oft-neglected book in the Old Testament, and see what it might teach us. We look forward to seeing you for a time of rest, rejuvenation and fellowship. 
# Scripture Readings

## Psalm 137

"By the rivers of Babylon—there we sat down and there we wept when we remembered Zion. On the willows there we hung up our harps. For there our captors asked us for songs, and our tormentors asked for mirth, saying, 'Sing us one of the songs of Zion!' How could we sing the Lord's song in a foreign land? If I forget you, O Jerusalem, let my right hand wither! Let my tongue cling to the roof of my mouth, if I do not remember you, if I do not set Jerusalem above my highest joy. Remember, O Lord, against the Edomites the day of Jerusalem's fall how they said, 'Tear it down! Tear it down! Down to its foundations!' O daughter Babylon, you devastator! Happy shall they be who pay you back what you have done to us! Happy shall they be who take your little ones and dash them against the rock!"

## Lamentations 3:19-26

"The thought of my affliction and my homelessness is wormwood and gall! My soul continually thinks of it and is bowed down within me. But this I call to mind, and therefore I have hope: The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. 'The Lord is my portion,' says my soul, 'therefore I will hope in him.' The Lord is good to those who wait for him, to the soul that seeks him. It is good that one should wait quietly for the salvation of the Lord."
