

## Welcome Guest Pastor Brody Van Roekel

James 2:1-7

Forsaking Favoritism for Friendship

This week our guest preacher is Brody Van Roekel: Brody serves as the Executive Director for Atlas: Lincoln, an adult mentoring and peer-support organization he helped found in Lincoln in 2018. In addition to serving with Atlas, he is active on the Board of Directors for several local organizations. Brody is also attending Phillips Theological Seminary in Tulsa, OK, and is under care for ordination in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in Nebraska. He serves as a Chaplain Candidate with the Nebraska Army National Guard. Living relationally has always been central to Brody's life, and he finds purpose in meaningful, diverse connections. Passionate about reaching marginalized populations, he is driven to empower others with hope and the tools for lasting change.

#### Psalm 145:1-5, 17-21

"I will extol you, my God and King, and bless your name forever and ever. Every day I will bless you, and praise your name forever and ever. Listen, my beloved brothers and sisters. Has not God chosen the poor in the world to be rich in faith and to be heirs of the kingdom that he has promised to those who love him? But you have dishonored the poor. Is it not the rich who oppress you? Is it not they who drag you into court? Is it not they who blaspheme the excellent name that was invoked over you?"
