

Lighting the Advent Wreath

One: The first three candles we lit were for HOPE, PEACE, and JOY. Today we light the fourth candle — the candle of LOVE. With this flame we testify to the love of God that surrounds and fills us at all time, but that especially reveals itself in the Christmas story. There is no greater power than LOVE. It is stronger than rulers and empires, stronger than grief or despair, stronger than even death. We love, because God first LOVED us.

Many: Loving God, we open ourselves to you this Christmas season. Light our lives with your imagination. Show us the creative power of hope; teach us the peace that comes from justice; fill us with the kind of joy that cannot be contained, but must be shared; and magnify your LOVE within us. Prepare our hearts to

be transformed by you that we may walk in the light of Christ.

One: Depart with the knowledge that you are LOVED and take with you the promise that God is always coming into the world. Seek LOVE not in a long ago stable or ancient manger, but in the people we meet and the depths of our own hearts. May the blessing of Christmas make you a blessing to others. Go forth in hope, peace, joy, and love.
